

TAX CORNER:

Some fascinating tax facts



We all love completing our tax returns – don't we? To get in the mood for the upcoming sourcing, collation and documentation of your financial records, here are a few interesting tax-related facts, courtesy of the Australian Taxation Office.


- For the 2011/12 financial year, the ATO collected \$301 billion in tax. This included the following amounts of income tax:
 - \$148.4 billion from individuals

- \$66.6 billion from companies
 - \$7.5 billion from superannuation funds
 - \$1.5 billion petroleum resource rent tax
 - \$3.7 billion in fringe benefits tax
- The ATO is hoping for around \$175 billion from individuals during the 2013/14 financial year.
 - Tax refunds totalled \$92.6 billion, with individual income tax refunds (\$25.5 billion) and activity statements (\$53.7 billion) taking the lion's share.
 - GST not included as all GST revenue goes to the States & Territories.
 - The ATO did collect less revenue than they were hoping for in the 2011/12 financial year...

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


What is Rotary?
