4. Motorcycle GP Centenary Celebrations – PP Geoff Fry advised all arrangements made although one more helper required for the Friday bike show and fare in Kings Parade at 4:00pm.
5. PP Brian Burke advised the meeting the Tucker Van is closing at the end of November and asked whether our club should take it over. After discussions, it was agreed that Brian together with Tony Pollard follow up on this matter in order to make a recommendation to the members and the Board.
6. PP Greg Madden spoke about the condition of our BBQ saying it is not good. Greg mentioned that a BBQ mounted on a trailer may be a replacement worth considering. Cost could be as high as \$ 5,000 but may be rented out at \$100 per time. Greg will obtain further details and report back.

Three Minuter

The "Three Minuter" was presented this week by PP Geoff Fry who started by asking the meeting who hadn't as yet been to Kanangra Walls; a surprising number of members haven't as yet been there.

Geoff went on to explain that The Kanangra Walls area is the main focus of activity in Kanangra-Boyd National Park. The car park at the end of the unsealed road provides the starting point for many walks into the wilderness, as well as the finishing point for many tourists who come to visit the lookouts. The Walls themselves are spectacular, orange and grey sandstone cliffs towering above the Kanangra Creek gorge that lies mostly in shadow below. Waterfalls cascade off the plateau behind into the vast depths. It is very much "the edge of wilderness".



Geoff also spoke about one fellow who in recent times, has become lost and is currently being looked for, as well as about a visit with his father and brothers made many years ago travelling there by means of a horse and cart. As Geoff suggests, a visit is very worthwhile, just don't become lost. Thank you Geoff.



Guest Speaker

Our guest speaker this evening was Rebecca Keith, the daughter of our esteemed President, with Rebecca speaking about her work as a Senior Change Manager.

Rebecca stated that: "Many business managers know what is wrong with their business but are not sure how to fix it" adding: "That's where I step in.....my job is to move people from (A.) to (B.)".

Rebecca has been undertaking this work for some twelve years now and goes where she is needed, with her duties not only being in Australia but in places such as Hong Kong, Singapore and elsewhere.

Although the type of work involved is varied, Rebecca mainly specializes in three areas: Private Banking (top 10% of individuals), Institutional Banking (top 10% company space) and Wealth. Consequently, her main customers are involved in large scale mergers and acquisitions.

In order to be able to carry the duties of a change manager, the manager must be embedded in the industry and must thoroughly understand the customer.

During her talk, Rebecca gave examples of how change is effected using a PowerPoint presentation to set out the steps involved and how to achieve the required outcomes.

At the conclusion of her talk, Rebecca was thanked for her efforts by the meeting with Peter doing the honors of presenting to Rebecca another of our Nobel Peace Prize winning coffee mugs.

Chatswood partners in Global Grant

The following has been taken from this week's edition of the Rotary Club of Chatswood's Bulletin "The Right Wheel", being an example of a successful international initiative undertaken by Chatswood in league with two other (overseas) Clubs. Perhaps something we could think about???

The **Rotary Club of Chatswood** is partnering with **Rotary Club of Brandywine Naamans** in Wilmington, Delaware USA and the **Rotary Club of Tamale** in Ghana to seek a Global Grant from The Rotary Foundation for a major water & sanitation project.

The project will cost \$73,631 USD to construct 150 Microflush Toilets in households and two community borehole water wells for the people of Nalerigu, a farming community with a population of more than 4,000 in the East Mamprusi District of the Northern Region of Ghana.

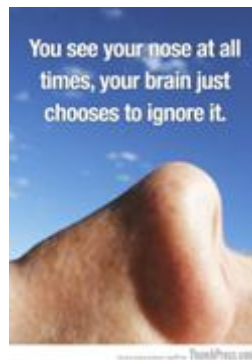
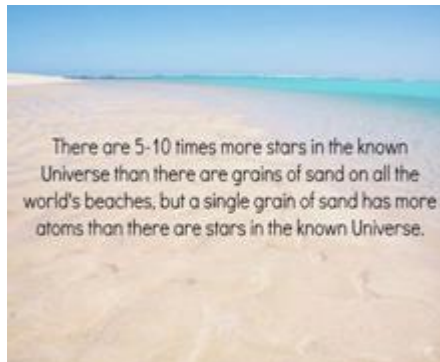

Consumer Corner: Shopping online

On line shopping from retail outlets both here in Australia and overseas continues to grow rapidly in popularity. However, there are many, many instances of consumers getting "ripped off", having their bank accounts emptied, their identities stolen or suffering other losses when attempting to purchase goods and services in this way.

You must take action to protect yourself, with the information which now follows being suggestions as to what you can do to cut out or at least, minimize and potential loss.

Firstly, Online (Australian) businesses selling goods and services must:

- ensure products and services meet Australian safety regulations
- not mislead you or hide costs and other details from you
- compete fairly to ensure a variety of choices on quality and price
- give you automatic guarantees with the right to ask for a repair, replacement, refund, cancellation or compensation as appropriate if there is a problem
- have the right to sell you a product – it mustn't be stolen and must belong to the business or individual and not come with any outstanding debts.

Secondly, Shopping online with an overseas business:

If you buy from an online seller based overseas, you should be aware that you may experience practical difficulties in obtaining a remedy from them.

Thirdly, Only consider buying from online sellers in Australia or overseas that:

- have a good reputation
- display clear processes for solving problems and giving replacements and refunds
- display clear systems for protecting the security and privacy of your personal and financial details
- display their business registration number, phone and fax numbers and physical address.
- Before buying, check terms and conditions carefully so you know what you're paying for and that there are no hidden costs or restrictions.

Before you start, ensure your computer, tablet or phone is secure by installing or updating security and anti-virus software.

Shop around. Ask questions and ask for pictures so you know what you are getting. Compare prices on different sites.

Last but not least -

- beware of sellers asking for your bank PIN or password. Never buy from these sellers. Report them to the ACCC.
- check that the site is secure. It should have a padlock symbol and an address starting with <https://>
- ensure that you can check the progress of your order online
- consider using a third-party escrow agent to pay for valuable items as they'll hold the payment in trust until you receive and accept the item.
- Keep copies of all documents, including electronic records of auction bids, item descriptions, emails and receipts in case there is a problem later.
- If there is a problem, email the seller outlining the issue and how you want it resolved.
- If you paid by credit card and you did not receive the product or service, contact your bank and ask them to reverse an unauthorised charge.

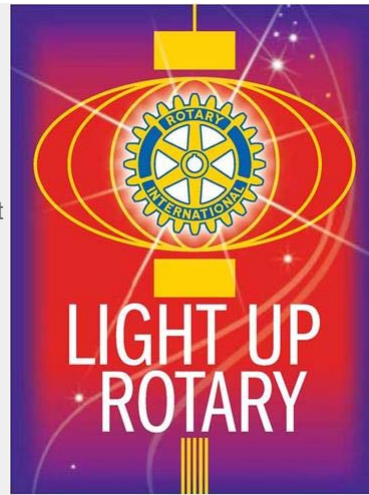
What is Rotary?
