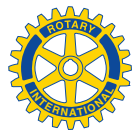


## Why Attend this District Conference?

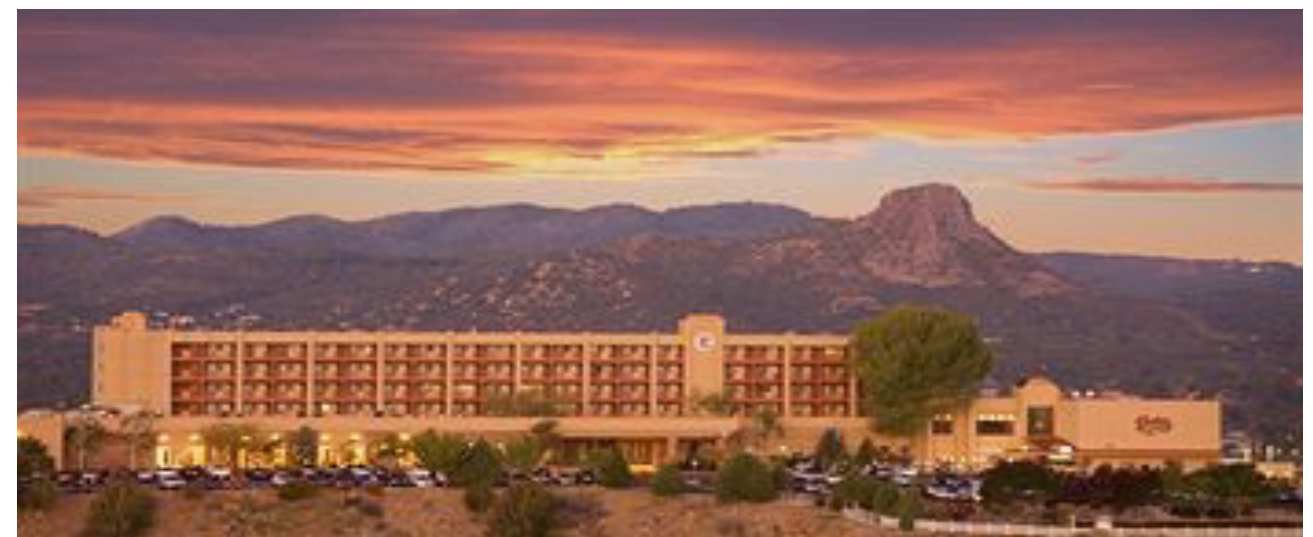

She served on the Executive Committee for the 2011 Zones 25/26 Rotary Institute and is serving as Chief of Staff for the 2012 Institute.

Wyn and Steve are natives of Louisiana, although Steve grew up in Marin County. The two met in Baton Rouge and were married there. Wyn taught middle school while Steve pursued his law degree. Following graduation from law school, they moved to California and made their home in Nevada City. Wyn is the Chairman and CEO of Nevada City Winery. Steve, also a member and President Nominee of the Rotary Club of Grass Valley, practices law in Nevada City and serves on the Winery's Board as Vice-President.

Wyn and Steve are Major Donors to the Rotary Foundation as well as Paul Harris and Bequest Society members. They share a deep interest in our Foundation's humanitarian work, have traveled to Uganda on a Matching Grant project and are currently working on a Health, Hunger and Humanity (3-H) Grant providing clean water, sanitation and goat husbandry, an outgrowth of the original matching grant project.

Wyn and Steve have three grown children, Lindsay, Katherine and Ross, who are pursuing careers in Los Angeles, New York and San Francisco. The family enjoys traveling together, especially by catamaran. All of the children are Paul Harris Fellows.

## Zones 25 and 26 Director Ken Boyd, PDG

RI Director 2011-13 Ken Boyd believes that one (1) individual can have a meaningful impact on the lives of many.

While at the University of Southern California ("Fight On"), Ken Boyd helped write a student association's Constitution which set into place the direction, foundation and focus for student government. This has affected literally hundreds of thousands of students.

In 1975 as the Kerman Rotary Club President, he oversaw a community service project that brought paramedics to his home town and surrounding communities. They have reported over 19,000 calls.

As a District Governor, his District ranked first in the United States for per capita giving to the Rotary Foundation for Districts giving over \$200,000. In the establishment of the Benefactor program, his District ranked 2nd in the United States and 7th in the world.

Rotary International has sent him to 37 countries to present the ideas of Rotary. He has spoken at several Peace Conferences, one (1) immediately after 911 in Cairo, Egypt and more recently between Turkey and Armenia. This was instrumental in breaking the impasse between two (2) countries that had stood for almost 100 years.

As Chairman of Rotary's World Membership and Retention effort, he and his Committee conceived, developed and implemented a program that resulted in the largest single year's growth in Rotary's history; approximately 55,000 net new members and 1,158 new Clubs, but more importantly generated an estimated seven million hours of humanitarian service over the first five (5) years. It also added approximately \$25 million dollars to Rotary's coffers.

In addition to his contributions to his community, nation and world, Ken Boyd and his wife Susan's greatest accomplishment is the raising of their four (4) children, Michelle, Cyndi, Joey and Ashli, plus they enjoy their 12 beautiful grandchildren, plus two (2) on the way.
