District 5490 is a very generous district when it comes to giving to the Rotary Foundation. But even in the most generous Districts there are individuals and even entire Rotary clubs who do not support the Rotary Foundation, usually because they think we have no business doing International Service which is supported by our Foundation. And they use that excuse for choosing not to give financially to our Foundation.

The common argument is that our own communities have problems and we should concentrate our efforts on taking care of our own.

I understand this argument, I do. But I would argue that they are only half right.

We should and we do address many humanitarian needs of our local communities. And we need to be absolutely committed to continuing our efforts to do this.

However, one needs to but open their eyes to see that there are billions of people in the world who lack basic human rights like clean drinking water, simple sanitation, and basic education. We take these things for granted, even within our poorest communities.

But for billions of others, these simple things are out of reach unless we help them. This kind of extreme poverty and suffering exists, and we cannot turn our heads away as if it doesn't.

Rotary's mission is to foster Peace and Goodwill in our world. This can only be done by facing extreme poverty and illiteracy head on in the places where it exists.

This kind of suffering breeds desperation and desperation breeds hate, especially among the illiterate. If we don't want extremist governments or terrorists to foster and cultivate this desperation among suffering people, and then harness that desperation to harm others, including our own families, then we must face these realities.


The Rotary Foundation programs build peace. We build peace by building <u>relationships</u> across cultures and borders, one person at a time. The enemy of peace is hatred. But it is almost impossible to hate someone that you have cooperated with on a Rotary Foundation project, even if you never meet them. Someone you may have given a helping hand to, or perhaps someone you may have hosted in your home. That is what is so unique and wonderful about Rotary. When we build relationships across borders and cultures, we build peace.

If anyone of us wants peace on earth for their family at home, we cannot ignore extreme poverty and ignorance in the far reaches of the globe. As long as there is extreme poverty anywhere, there will never be peace everywhere. The two are inextricably connected.

And the Rotary Foundation, our Foundation, is the vehicle that facilitates our work to alleviate extreme poverty.

The most successful Rotary clubs know this, and they harness and leverage the power of the Rotary Foundation to accomplish their international humanitarian efforts. This takes knowledge about Foundation programs and it takes financial support from every Rotarian.

I encourage all Rotarians to give voluntarily to the Rotary Foundation in support of these efforts. Every Rotarian, Every Year means just that. Rotary encourages all of its members to give at least \$100 per year, every year. That's just about 28 cents a day to address extreme poverty and illiteracy. To literally save lives and work towards a more peaceful world.

Mario Almanza and Gift of Life-AZ Express Their Appreciation!

On the morning of March 1, 2011, 12 vear old Mario Alsufferina manza. from a congenital heart defect was operated on at the University Medical Center in Tucson to correct a large Atrial Septal Defect that was diagnosed back in 2000. Since then

Mario has not been able to play like a normal growing child as he experienced breathing and palpitations that hindered his activities and without correction he most likely would soon experience heart failure if not corrected.

His successful surgery was performed by Pediatric Cardiologists, Dr. Michael Teodori and Dr. Aleem Siddique along with Anesthesiologist, Dr. Bowden from the University Medical Center. Mario's recovery was exceptionally fast for this type of heart operation and he was released from the hospital three days later with further follow up scheduled for the next few weeks. *His prognosis is now to lead a normal and healthy life*. Another child has been saved through the teamwork of the hospital, skilled doctors and nurses, Rotary Clubs, Rotarians and Friends of GOL-AZ who financially support and volunteer for GOL-AZ.

Mario is now the 21st child from Arizona, USA and the 252nd child that has become a part of the GOL-AZ family which has now touched 24 different countries around the world. What a great way to build goodwill, friendship and to promote world peace. It is not often that you have the opportunity to help save a child's life, let alone 252 and the number is presently growing as we look at those waiting yet to have their heart defects mended.
