

RECAP

Last week's **Rotary Minute** was delivered by Esther Degollado who talked about the history of "Rotary Ann's". In many Rotary clubs throughout the world, wives of male members are affectionately called "Rotary Ann's." This started in 1914 when San Francisco Rotarians boarded a special train to attend the Rotary Convention in Houston - in those days few wives attended Rotary events – so the only woman aboard was the wife of Rotarian Bru Brunnier, She was introduced as the Rotarian's Ann. One of the greeters was Guy Gundaker of Philadelphia, whose wife was also named Ann, someone started the Rotary Ann chant. The two petite ladies, Ann Brunnier and Ann Gundaker, were hoisted to the men's shoulders and paraded about the hall. The group loved the title given to the two women named Ann. Immediately the same term of endearment was used for all of the wives in attendance. and the name "Rotary Ann" was here to stay.

The program continued with a presentation by Gina Palma, Sr. Business Development Officer at LiftFund, a non-profit Community Development Financial Institution (CDFI) and Community Development Corporation (CDC) that supports small business owners with limited access to capital through small business loans and technical support for their dreams of entrepreneurship. Ms. Palma share that since 1994 they've provided over \$150 million of dollars in micro and small business loans to 15,000 diverse, hardworking entrepreneurs. Just this year they have helped 700 entrepreneurs totaling \$14 million dollars and over 2,000 individuals served with business and financial education. LiftFund offers small business loans from \$500 to \$500,000 for terms of 6 to 120 months and fixes rates that vary from 7 to 12.5% every. Financing is not the only thing offered, their clients also receive online business educations and financial & business management consultations. According to

Ms. Palma, the helps fund startups with lower rates than credit cards and payday lenders and lower credit scores are considered. LiftFund also offer flexibility on collateral requirements, plus clients are connected to other small business resources available in our community. She concluded the presentation by talking about two of the current lending offers available in partnership with the City of Laredo.
