



RECAP

Last Friday, Ed Ramirez Jr gave the Rotary Minute and he went over the earliest Rotary Clubs and when they were founded. Everyone knows that Chicago was first in 1905 but it was almost 4 years later that the second club was chartered in San Francisco on November, 1908. In 1909, five more clubs were chartered: Oakland, Seattle, Los Angeles, New York City, and Boston. There were ten clubs chartered in the US in 1910 and Rotary became international that year with the addition of the Club in Winnipeg, Manitoba, Canada. In Texas, the first Clubs were all chartered in 1912: Dallas, Houston, and San Antonio. In our District, Laredo was chartered in 1917, Corpus Christi in 1920, and Brownsville in 1921. Mexico City was chartered in April 1921 as the first club in Mexico. Our Daybreak club was founded in 1984. 67 years after the Laredo Rotary Club! We are the second oldest club in Laredo.

Our guest speakers gave us an update on a presentation they made last year. Cousins Adriana Medrano and Ana Ramos, both graduates from TAMIU, spoke about the careers they are now pursuing and how being the recipients of the Rotary District 5930 Costa Rica International Medical Brigade Experience scholarship has made an impact on their lives. As a recap, this experience allowed them to volunteer in the community and form meaningful relationships. Adriana and Ana talked about their volunteer work at a nursing home in Alajuela, Costa Rica, that I still s in dire need of assistance and that they have been communicating with organizations to help create sustainable **Kotar**v e Above Self k, say o
