HOW WE ARE FEEDING PEOPLE IN OUR COMMUNITY

Our club is doing a tremendous amount of work to help feed those in need in Baldwinsville and even beyond, through programs and giving. First, we have our Backpack Program, providing food to elementary students at risk of hunger on the weekends. Social workers slip bags of snacks and breakfast items into their backpacks each Friday, and we provide food to the pantries at Ray Middle School and Durgee Junior High. We are waiting on more requests from the school and plan to grow to serve all their needs utilizing the massive amount of donations we received from the Turkey Trot race food drive, a collaboration between Kiwanis, St. Mary's, St. Augustine and St. Elizabeth Ann Seton. Thanks to everyone who filled a Wegman's bag with food for the VFW Food Pantry and to everyone who volunteers at our fundraisers like Seneca River Days to provide the funding for our club to fill all 31 bags. We received a donation in honor of Richard Black, a WWII veteran from Vestal NY, that will also provide 31 \$20 gift cards for the veterans to use for personal items at Walmart.

Our third food-related project this season is the Old Newsboys. The money we raise hawking the newspaper for two mornings will go to the Syracuse Christmas Bureau, which serves thousands of CNY families in need, providing food, books and toys at Christmas.

The club has also made monetary donations to the Baldwinsville Community Food Pantry and

the Baldwinsville Community Food Pantry and the Volunteer Center for their Thanksgiving and Christmas Bureaus.
