WHY ARE DUES DUE ON JUNE 15TH?

To answer that, we have to tell you a little bit about how the sausage is made. Our membership data lives in a database that both the district and Rotary International (RI) can access. The dues they both charge us are based on how many members we have in our database. It's vital to our club's finances that our database accurately reflects the number of dues-paying members we have because they will check the database on July 1 and that is the number of members for which we will be billed. You cannot contest this amount nor ask to amend your membership numbers at that point. Our club cannot afford to be on the hook for dues for people who have not yet paid. We have been burned by this before and can no longer take someone's word for it. We must have payment in hand. If we don't, your membership status gets changed to "inactive." As soon as we do receive your dues payment, we can switch you back to "active" again. It's not a big deal, but that is additional work for the club secretary, so it's really kinder of you to pay on time. We set the deadline for June 15th to allow the club secretary time to update the database. There is a lot of coordination behind the scenes between the club secretary and treasurer, as well as members of the membership team, to track dues payments being received, share communications about dues that are owed and ensure that our database is in tip-top shape before the end of the Rotary year. It is important to know that if your dues are not received and your status gets changed to inactive, it's not at all personal. It's a policy that's been put in place in order to protect our club's finances.

So please let this article serve as your reminder that dues are due by June 15th. That means check in hand or Venmo payment complete.

And please thank your club leaders (Lizzy, Bruce and soon-tobe Jennifer) who take the time to carefully manage our database and keep our club finances in the black!

WHAT A DIFFERENCE \$1,000 CAN MAKE

A \$1,000 contribution to The Rotary Foundation pays for the materials needed to build a deep bore well in India that will supply clean drinking water to more than 300 people. It provides materials to treat and prevent parasites and anemia in children in Brazil or pays for a tree nursery in Jamaica that will help 700 farmers increase their income. It can provide a cow and animal husbandry training to a woman in Uganda, where children often don't get enough protein and calcium. It can pay for the polio vaccine for 2,000 children in Nigeria or provide \$50 microloans that allow 20 women in Nicaragua to start businesses.
