## POLIO DAY & CONFERENCE WRAP-UP

All the Baldwinsville Rotarians who attended the World Polio Day Dinner and/or the Conference of Clubs reported back about how nice it was to come together in person and that the presenters were all fantastic. Both events were held in Liverpool the last weekend of October with the World Polio Day Dinner taking place first, on Friday evening. It included Rotarians from across upstate New York and four Rotary districts. Keynote speaker Rotary International President-Elect Jennifer Jones traveled from Rotary headquarters with her husband to be part of the festivities. She has been the lead on many successful fundraisers to help End Polio Now, is well-informed on the efforts as a Rotary International Trustee and has participated in immunization events around the world. Her way of addressing the group is intimate, moving and leaves a lasting impact on those in attendance. The District Governors of the four Empire districts pulled together their resources to present her with a donation of \$155,000 to End Polio Now. With the matching funds from the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation, that amount will grow to almost half a million dollars! Saturday morning, in the same conference room, just our district came together for our annual conference, which District Governor Dana deemed the Conference of Clubs. The day celebrated the work of our clubs and the support our district leaders lend to them. It started with another address from Jennifer Jones at breakfast, inspiring us once again with her humility, experience and care. It was a great opportunity to snag a photo with the future leader of our organization (see the THREE Jennifers below!). Throughout the day, attendees heard from past youth exchange students, clubs that are celebrating 75 years of service and the new Diversity, Equity & Inclusion Committee that will be visiting clubs in the coming months. There were a lot of opportunities to socialize and visit the House of Friendship with an extended lunch hour. Our display in the House of Friendship highlighted the Backpack Program and was put together by Meg and Mary - thanks to them both. Hopefully Rotarians enjoyed our free raisins! The next conference won't be until the first weekend of May in 2023, when we will hopefully be past the pandemic and can fully enjoy the Thousand Islands Resort in Clayton, NY. # ASK ROTARY

**QUESTION:** What is the "Old Newsboys" and what does our club do for them?

**ANSWER:** The Old Newsboys' Hope for the Holidays program started 90 years ago with newspaper delivery kids collecting donations to provide families who needed help heating their homes in the winter. It later transformed to collecting money for toys, and is now a partner with the United Way and Salvation Army to support their annual Christmas Bureau that provides food, toys and books for thousands of families in need in Onondaga County each holiday. One part of the program that continues on is the idea of hawking newspapers, which are donated by The Post-Standard as something to "trade" in the community in exchange for donations. People can give as little or as much as they want in order to get a copy of the paper that day and all of it goes to the Christmas Bureau. To get the papers out there, groups like our Rotary Club set up stations at area locations that are high traffic so we can connect with the community. You will find hawkers at the mall, at coffee shops and gas stations, grocery stores and diners. Many are part of teams, so there is a little bit of a competitive element. The only other local Rotary Club participating has historically been DeWitt Rotary, who beats us by hawking longer hours and at more locations. The number of places we can be depends solely on how many Rotarians want to volunteer for a one-hour shift on a Friday and/or Saturday morning to help out. There is no shortage of locations or newspapers - all can be arranged! This year's Hope for the Holidays collection will be Friday 12/10 and Saturday 12/11 and we'll plan on at least being at our usual location of the Dunkin on Genesee Street in the village. In addition to it being for a great cause, it's simple to do, allows for social distancing, and is really fun because you get to spread holiday cheer in the community we love. 
