Club President Meg has asked members to wear their End Polio Now shirts on October 24th, but what happens if someone asks you about our work to end this debilitating disease? How much do you know? Here is some information to help you have some fast facts up your sleeve:

- Rotary committed to the eradication of polio 30 years ago
- We have vaccinated more than 2.5 billion children since we started
- Today, there are just three countries with the wild polio virus Afghanistan, Pakistan and Nigeria
- When we started the program, there were hundreds of thousands of new cases of polio each year
- To date in 2018, there have been 18 new cases of polio
- A country must go three years without a new case of polio to be certified polio-free
- The US spends approximately \$640 million on vaccinating children again polio in our country
- By the time our efforts are complete, Rotary will have contributed over \$2.2 billion to the cause
- We partner with the World Health Organization, the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation, UNICEF, and others to be fully funded and have the resources needed to deliver vaccines
- Tax-deductible donations can be made at www.endpolio.org/donate
- We have coin jars at many local businesses with 100% of the proceeds going to the efforts to end polio!
