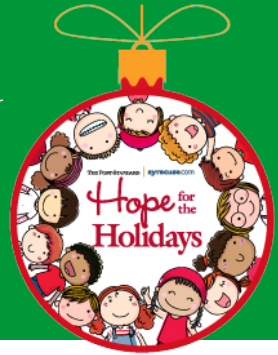
# NOVEMBER STUDENTS OF THE MONTH

## ASK ROTARY

*Ask anything about Rotary, our club or our language. Submit your questions to Lizzy each month to get your answers!*

**QUESTION:** I hear a lot of acronyms being used and I don't know what they mean. There's something called RILA or RLI. I don't know if they are the same or even what they are. Can you please translate?

**ANSWER:** Yes, we have a lot of acronyms in Rotary. We try to say the full names of things when new members are within earshot, but we're also human and can forget. Never hesitate to ask a Rotarian if they say an acronym you have not heard of before! The ones you mentioned are RYLA and RLI and they are two very different things. RYLA stands for Rotary Youth Leadership Awards. This is a program our district hosts each summer where high school sophomores and juniors spend a weekend at Cazenovia College honing their leadership skills. The goal is to promote volunteering as a great opportunity for them to grow as leaders. Our club sponsors two students to attend each year (hopefully it will be reinstated in 2022 after two years off due to COVID). RLI stands for Rotary Leadership Institute, so I guess they aren't totally different since the "R" and the "L" stand for the same things! Rotary Leadership Institute is a partner program for Rotary that teaches leadership skills to Rotarians. It's a facilitated learning program where Rotarians come to share successes and challenges on various topics. There are three levels of this training to complete in order to graduate and then graduate classes offered for ongoing education. It's an awesome program where you can learn a lot about Rotary, meet more Rotarians from other clubs and even pick up some leadership skills you can use in all areas of your life. Our club pays for members to attend, so plan to sign up when dates are posted for courses that are often virtual these days. See the list to the right of some other commonly used acronyms in Rotary and keep the great questions coming!

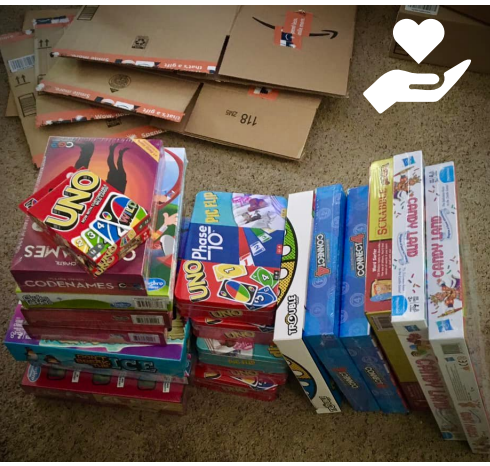
