# **BIG CHILL HAS GREAT WEATHER & ATTENDANCE**

The B'ville Big Chill is a three-part event celebrating the season, our community and raising money for some great causes. It starts with the polar plunge where teams raise money daring them to dunk themselves in the frozen river - brrr! The top three teams this year were VFW Post 152, raising \$4,383, followed by WT Brew's Crew with \$3,579 and in third place is Pastime Athletic Club with \$2,088.68. Our team, the Rotary Plungers, raised \$1,021 - great job guys! The second feature of the day is the Best in Bowl, where people can pay \$5 to get into our warm tent and taste food from local venues. The tent was hopping for several hours as people came to support their friends and family jumping in the river and then stayed to have a bite. The third feature was the Poker Bear Express pub crawl, with eight participating bars in the village. Participants paid \$10 for a ticket and drew a card at each location to try to get the best poker hand. The winner was Casey C of Syracuse with four kings. Overall, participation was up compared to last year, which should help overcome some increased costs (like the tent rental). We split the funds with the chamber and have chosen the Backpack Project to receive a portion of those funds. Our goal is to be able to expand the program to provide food for more children in need!
