Go Direct in 2017

If you've resolved to give to the Rotary International Foundation in 2017, there is a very easy way to make it a resolution that sticks - Rotary Direct.

Rotary Direct allows you to schedule donations to our foundation that automatically come out of your bank account or get charged to a credit card. The amount and frequency of the donations is up to you! Rotarians are encouraged to give at least \$100 each year, which breaks down to a little over \$8 per month. This level of giving isn't a big monthly expense for many of us, but it will make a big impact through Rotary.

A \$100 donation will fill three backpacks with school supplies for children in Honduras. It could help prevent, diagnose and treat malaria in Mali with 50 malaria tests. It would also provide a bio-sand filter and water hygiene training for one family in Peru.




NEXT Book Club
