Events will be more family-focused with a magic show, live music, fun trivia, food trucks and ducks on sale all day.


When the afternoon ends we will ask all guests to leave the island as we rearrange a few things to prepare for the evening.

## HYBRID MEETING ETIQUETTE

Here are some important things to know and keep in mind with our new, hybrid meeting format.

#### When attending online:

- -Zoom will be muted when you first log on because the noise in the meeting room would probably sound raucous and terrible through the computer
- -Be prepared to use key features in Zoom like the chat box and the hand-raising feature to get our attention if you need something or want to participate in the conversation
- -Be sure to mute yourself so your sound is not inadvertently coming through to us -We definitely want to know if you are having trouble hearing us or seeing

something!

#### When attending in-person:

- -Feel free to engage with guests on zoom by waving into the camera (not the TV, the cameras on the laptops around the room)
- -Keep side conversations and background sounds to a minimum because they will be much more distracting to those online and could cut into the sound of the main speaker

So far hybrid meetings are going pretty well and we have had people logging on each time. We hope you will take advantage of the virtual option whenever it makes Rotary more convenient to attend and that you will still join us in person when possible for a better opportunity to socialize with one another.

**ANSWER**: "Classification" is just Rotary's fancy way of saying "job title." This used to be really important in Rotary because clubs were limited to one member per classification. That's right - one lawyer, one mechanic, one teacher. Some clubs had people waiting in line to be the next in their classification to join. Thankfully, both for the purposes of membership growth and for clubs like ours with all of our insurance salespeople and realtors, that's a thing of the past. Today, a classification or job title is really just something we share with one another to celebrate our vocations (another fancy word that just means your trade or profession). What we do for a living is so important to Rotary that vocation is one of our five avenues of service. We want to know your job title so we can either tap into your professional skills for a service project or leadership role, or because we want to do business with fellow Rotarians - people we know we can trust as ethical both in business and in life. People who follow The Four Way Test.
