We held our first ever Pizza for Pantries event, which yielded over \$3,000 to be split between the Baldwinsville Community Food Pantry, the veterans pantry at the VFW and our Backpack Program. Special thanks to Scott and Ken for organizing and for all the Rotarians that assisted. Through the generosity of our members, we collected 99 lbs of dog and cat food to support Humane CNY as our donation program and we decorated lunch bags for Meals on Wheels to help bring a smile to those receiving them.




# HAPPY NEWS
