WE BUILT 25+ BEDS FOR CHILDREN IN NEED

On Saturday, October 10th, Rotary volunteers came together at the headquarters for <u>Sleep in Heavenly Peace Syracuse</u>, an organization that provides complete beds for children who are otherwise sleeping on the floor, sharing sleeping quarters or are on improvised beds. The organization has chapters all around the US, with our Syracuse chapter being very busy delivering over 1,300 beds since it was started just a couple years ago. Our club funded this build for \$3,500, which is enough to provide 25 beds, including the frame, mattress and bedding. More than a dozen volunteers that included Interact students, potential members, friends and family, came to saw, sand and assemble for a little over three hours on a sunny Saturday morning. 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Our club kicked off World Polio Day on Saturday, October 24th with a march through the village that included Interact students, Rotarians from around the district and our District Governor Cheryl Matt. Everyone gathered at Mercer Park for a check presentation from the district to D7150 Polio Chair Randy Wilson. Marchers carried banners with messages about Rotary's commitment to fight disease around the world. We chanted and greeted the community on the walk to Baldwin Canal Square, where signs were put into the ground, and Randy spoke about our progress and a future without polio. WE RAISED MONEY TO FIGHT POLIO

Immediately following the march, our drive-thru fundraiser at WT Brews began with custom beer and freshly fried sugar waffles available for sale. Dave Horan and volunteer Alan Lindsey took the lead on teaching everyone how to fry sugar waffles, while WT's members Michelle and Mike stationed the drive-thru. They brewed a maple cinnamon amber ale, called MC Amber, and bottled it for sale at \$7 each. There were a couple of times when the drive-thru was full, but thanks to the cold, rainy day it was slow going. At the end of the day, thanks to our work and the generosity of WT Brews, we still raised over \$1,100! \$75 of that came from the sale of End Polio Day face masks sewn and donated by Jennifer Joslyn too. With the matching dollars from the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation, our event will net over \$3,000 to help combat polio and support healthcare delivery systems that will also work towards tamping down coronavirus. Even with a lower turn out from the community, it was rewarding for all the volunteers to have something meaningful to do, together, in real life.
