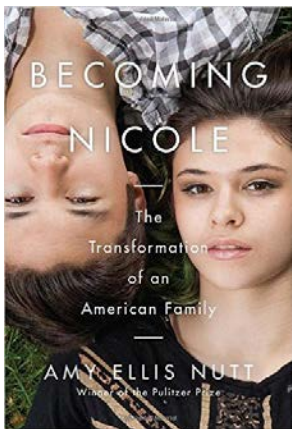
Fun Orientation Weekend
