

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From the president:

September is Basic Education and Literacy Month in Rotary. Worldwide, 67 million children have no access to education and more than 775 million people over the age of 15 are illiterate. By contributing to the Rotary International Foundation (RIF) we support educational projects that provide technology, teacher training, vocational training teams, student meal programs, and low-cost textbooks to communities.

As we celebrate this Centennial year for the Rotary International Foundation, be proud of the good your contributions are doing. In celebration of our Foundation's centennial, I challenge each of our members to donate the original amount of \$26.50 that started the Foundation in 1917. The Rotary International Foundation is what makes our "Doing Good In The World" possible.

Foundation Feature Who is Arch C. Klumph?

Arch C. .Klumph was born in 1869 in Conneautville, Pennsylvania. He was a veteran of the Spanish-American war and president of several companies throughout his career. At age 42 he helped charter the Rotary Club of Cleveland, OH and thus began a life of service through Rotary. He became the sixth Rotary International President, after only five years of being a member. During the Rotary International Convention in Atlanta, GA in June of 1917, he proposed that we start, "an endowment fund for Rotary . . . for the purpose of doing good in the world in charitable, educational, and other avenues of community service." The first contribution came from the Kansas City, Missouri Rotary Club in the amount of \$26.50. The first grant, for \$500, went to the International Society for Crippled Children, which later became Easter Seals. The foundation withstood The Great Depression and difficult times during World War II. However, many were inspired to contribute in honor of our founder Paul Harris after his passing in 1947. Many programs, like Group Study Exchange and Rotary Peace Programs were developed and funded by the RI Foundation over the years. In 2004, the Arch C Klumph Society was formed to recognize donors who have given \$250,000 or more and honor the legacy our foundation's founder started. We are also hosting an information night in September to recruit host families, as well as outbound students for the 2017/18 school year, so spread the word!




