THIS WEEK'S PROGRAM THE END OF SCARCITY - JACK BOWERS



"A shale oil boom means the U.S. will overtake Saudi Arabia as the world's largest oil producer by 2020, a radical shift that could profoundly transform not just the world's energy supplies, but also its geopolitics," the International Energy Agency said last month, according to a recent article in the Dow Jones Newswires.

"By around 2020, the United States is projected to become the largest global oil producer" and to overtake Saudi Arabia for a time, the agency said. "The result is a continued fall in U.S. oil imports [currently at 20% of its needs] to the extent that North America becomes a net oil exporter around 2030."

This major shift will be driven primarily by the faster-than-expected development of hydrocarbon resources locked in shale and other tight rock formations that have just started to be unlocked by a new combination of two technologies: hydraulic fracturing and horizontal drilling.

An article in the Wall Street Journal this week asked, "Could 2013 find California lawmakers and Gov. Jerry Brown finally making the connection between fiscal challenges and energy markets? The Golden State is well positioned to become an exporter of hydrocarbons and enjoy a gusher of oil revenues." The article continued to say, "California has Saudi Arabia-scale oil resources, notably in its largely untapped Monterey shale field, which stretches northeast for more than 200 miles from Bakersfield in central California. New technologies, especially smart, horizontal drilling and hydrofracturing, aka "fracking," make that oil accessible, and cleanly." The article concludes with, "For California, it could be back-to-the-future, a well-funded future, courtesy of technology again unleashing wealth from natural resources. That would be quite a future to behold, and quite a legacy for Gov. Brown."

This Tuesday, Ron Martinez and Bart Ruud present Jack Bowers, CEO of Independent Fidelity Investors Inc which publishes Fidelity Monitor & Insight. Bowers will take a look at the global energy situation and how it will be impacted by the shale boom, the expanding role of liquefied natural gas, and transportation alternatives that are becoming increasingly viable.
