THIS WEEK'S PROGRAM RICHARD DEL BALSO: NORDIXX POLE WALKING

Nordixx Pole Walking (NPW) is one of the fastest growing activities in the world today that improves fitness and health. It is like cross country skiing, only on paths and trails yearround. Just 30 minutes of NPW is significantly more effective that 50 minutes of regular walking, with increased health benefits. NPW burns more calories, incorporates nearly 90 percent of all body muscles, improves diabetes metabolism, and reduces high blood pressure; all in a low impact exercise that improves balance, stability and posture. Compared to regular walking, NPW involves applying force to the poles with each stride. NPW uses more of the entire body (with greater intensity) and receives fitness building stimulation not present in normal walking.
