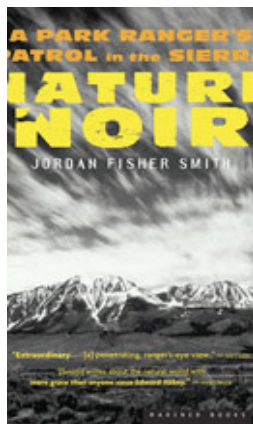

I was now feeling drugged or drunk most of the time; my brain was full of spirochetes, a doctor told me later, and the inflammatory nature of the body's reaction to them causes swelling in the walls of small arteries, resulting in decreased blood to flow to the brain. When I finished my errand at the ranger station, I started home again. But I wasn't sure anymore exactly how to get there. I pulled over to the side of the road and called my wife on my cell phone, then sat there waiting for her to come and get me."
