## **FROM THE DUGOUT AREA 4**

#### GRASS VALLEY

The Rotary Club of Grass Valley was chartered in 1925 and has been led this year by President Kris Stepanian. At present it has 69 members. The accomplishments this year include the following:

- Pledged \$500 for Smiles without Borders-Ensenada and sent one Rotarian to the project site
- Supported DG Tina Spencer-Mulhern by donating to the Rotary Rose Parade float
- Pledged \$25,000 to the Sierra Nevada Memorial Hospital Foundation for the Emergency Room Renovation project
- Participated in Wreaths Across America and donated \$500
- Members volunteered for a full day of bell ringing for the Salvation Army
- Members donated \$2000 to victims of wildfire by passing the hat
- Supported the community by donating over \$6000 to non-profits
- Provided \$6000 in scholarships to graduating high school seniors
- Exceeded the annual Rotary Foundation Giving goal
- Spearheaded the Area 4 Business Directory
- Participated in the Area 4 Rotary Osher scholarship for incoming sophomores at Sierra College
- Met the Polio Plus goal of \$1500
- Participated in the Area 4 Heritage Garden project, and contributed \$2000, plus a matching district grant of \$2500
- Completed the President's Project at the NorthStar Mining Museum and Glen Jones Park, with 30+ Rotarians in a hands-on workforce, contributing \$1700 in materials, plus a district grant of \$750
- Inducted 16 new Rotarians into the club
- Increased young member percentage
- Increased female member percentage
- Raised \$24,600 through the "Mardi Gras" Casino Night fundraiser
- Purchased two teleprompters and provided a "news" desk for Lyman Gilmore Middle School
- Hosted and supported an inbound RYE student
- Provided \$7100 in sponsorships for RYLA, REGL and RYE students
- Provided monthly Student of the Month Awards for outstanding Lyman Gilmore Middle School students
- Supported Interact at Lyman Gilmore Middle School

- Chaired an Area 4 Social dinner and theatre event
- Participated in Area/Club Music and Speech contests
- Provided holiday meals to local women and families in need
- Participated in the 2nd Annual Area 4 Rotary Community Awards event
- Expanded scope and outreach for the Annual Gold Country Bike Challenge fundraiser by partnering with Big Bros/Big Sisters and the Nevada City Classic to create a Cycling weekend in Western Nevada County

### GRASS VALLEY SOUTH

The "Biggest Little Rotary Club" continues to serve the greater Grass Valley area in lots of different ways under the leadership of President Adam Weiss.

The most exciting project, and certainly the biggest, was completing the installation of the Heritage Garden at the North Star Historic Conservancy in



conjunction with four other Area clubs (Grass Valley, Nevada City, Penn Valley and Nevada City 49er). The property is most noted as being the home of A.D. Foote the superintendent of the North Star Mine in the late 1800s. Also of note,



the home was designed by renowned architect Julia Morgan (also famous for designing the Hearst Castle). After the shutdown of the mine, the house and property had a sorted history that left the grounds in a sad state of vandalism and dilapidation. Since its purchase by the conservancy, 'things are a changing!'

The house is being fully and authentically restored and the grounds beautified. Currently, the grounds and house are used for weddings, community events, farmers markets, as well as a corporate meeting location. It is certainly a feather in the cap of Rotary to have been a part of this wonderful restoration.



The Rotary Club of Grass Valley South also sponsors and participates in a reading program for kindergarteners, Wreaths Across America, we adopt families at Christmas and provided jammies and toys, we worked along side another local business to clean up and beautify Western Gateway Park in Penn Valley, we sponsored and worked the Smiles without



Borders project, and supported the youth of the community with various scholarships, opportunities, and worked closely with the Interacters and FFA at Bear River high school.

We raise funds with two major events during the year. First is our night golf tournament and Bunko party. Golfers dawn neon LED glowing attire and decorate golf carts and try to score after the sun goes down. Bunko players dress up, have fun and party indoors while golfers light up the night sky with their creative carts, outfits, and glowing golf balls. OH, I almost forgot....so much fun was had, we even made the police blotter!

Our other major fundraiser is our St Patrick's Day party. Excellent food and

abundant drink are the backbone of the event. With this being the third annual event, we really hit our stride this year! ### NEVADA CITY

Nevada City Rotary club projects encompass the entire spectrum of Rotary by supporting and being involved at all levels of giving both sweat and check equity to all the traditional RI, District 5190, and Area 4 projects such as RYLA, REGL, and Speech and Music contests. Our 100% Paul Harris Club continues to be an EREY club. We support most District events by providing co-chairs, breakout presenters, Sergeant-at-Arms and with club attendance. Our youth outreach includes sponsoring Girls Who Code, hosting the weekly meetings, in addition to sponsoring ACME Robotics and several students from Seven Hills Middle School for the Nature Bridge experience. We are actively pursuing a Youth Programs relationship with SAEL. Each year we host a field day with Adaptive Education and the Leadership class at Seven Hills Middle School. We also partnered with Twin Ridges Charter School to clean up the trail to Sugar Loaf in Nevada City. Thirteen of our members and spouses traveled to Los Barriles, Mexico for the fifth year in a row to work with our sister club there to refurbish and improve their medical clinic while assisting with medical screens for vision and blood pressure. The President of our sister club in Astana, Kazakhstan spent a week with us gathering information on available equipment for their recently completed playground designed for children with special needs. This year we launched a very successful fundraising effort that we call Hungary Games that we feel we can grow in the years ahead. We go out several times a year to clean parks, trails, and plant flowers. We work closely with the City of Nevada City to maintain Miners Trail, which our club built, and also Penzance Park. Speaking of trails, if you want to know more about our truly vibrant and amazing Club, feel free to join our "Rambling Rotarians" on our weekly Tuesday morning walk along the various trails around Nevada City.

#### NEVADA CITY 49ER BREAKFAST

This has been a very busy year at the 49er Rotary Club. Our in town projects consisted of multiple Senior Wood deliveries, finishing the interior stairs at the North Star House, participating in the Area 4 Heritage Garden project, as well as the work we will be doing out at Pioneer Park for Rotarians at Work day. At the same time, all of the RYE Club Counselors and Youth Exchange Officers are in the middle of getting their 2019-2020 students in for the upcoming year. These cycles overlap and there is no downtime for the counselors. As they are working with the inbound students, they are also shepherding the outbound students preparing to go out on exchange.

Everyone responsible for the safety and security and management of the inbound student's year has many stories to tell. I have heard of counselors and host families being invited to their student's wedding. Now, that's an honor. Our District RYE Committee members have traveled to the countries of their past inbound students and connected with the families over and over. The exchange experience is understandably one that impacts the students for the rest of their lives and their families are grateful for how Rotary made it all possible. We often point out how a good relationship with the student as a counselor or host family can make future international travel better than Airbnb or a timeshare.

This month I wanted to share a recent trip by Jim VanWinkle to Brazil where he met with former students, Luiz Almeidade Oliveria (referenced a few times in the past year of RYE articles) and Manoela Signorini. Jim shares his thoughts on the trip:

One of the joys in working with Rotary exchange students as both a host parent and as a counselor is that in most cases you maintain that relationship for life. We are still close to one of our exchange students we hosted over 20 years ago, have visited her in Australia and she has been back here twice.

These students are by in large some of the most intelligent, hardworking and adventurous people you will ever meet. We have enjoyed our time spent visiting our former exchange student from Spain, Alvaro Gomez Ramirez, and his family as well.

This is a beautiful small city where we enjoyed some wonderful and famous Brazilian steaks for lunch. We were fortunate to meet all of Manu's other relatives and then visited the local zoo. When we returned to São Paulo, we were treated to some spectacular art museums, beautiful parks in a very interesting and vibrant city of a mere 12 million people.

My wife and I truly enjoyed visiting with these wonderful young adults and are looking forward to visiting them again in the future We know they will be coming back to Reno to visit their American friends. It goes without saying that the students you host or support will always be considered friends for life.

And Luiz shared with me his time with Jim and his wife on their trip:

I had a really great time here with Jim and Ellie. You should come someday! The trip to São Paulo also gave me the opportunity to meet Manoela, a former 5190 inbound from Brazil, and her father, who is now someone I'm sure will be able to help me in the future in the field I'm planning to specialize.

Jim and Ellie were a little bit scared of the crazy traffic in São Paulo, but we visited some nice places such as museums and a very popular Market where we were able to have a tour of Brazilian fruits. It was indeed a great time!

There are many other students to whom I feel close as well.

As a counselor, my first exchange student was Wendy (Wen-Hsuan) Lin from Taiwan. She was so young – we celebrated her 16th birthday in March 2012 – and yet amazingly mature. In fact, while at the restaurant the night of her Sweet 16 birthday dinner, she leaned over to me and whispered, "Why are we here?" I asked her if they celebrated birthdays this way in Taiwan. And I learned that, no, birthdays are not commonly celebrated like we do here.

I have remained in contact with Wendy. She is a very talented artist and while at Reno High School a painting of Wen's was selected for the Reno High School permanent art collection for the 2011-2012 school year. The award presentation was made at their 'Fine Arts Night' at the McKinley Art Center. All money raised at that event is for scholarships for the Humanities department. In the following summer of 2013, Wendy returned to the U.S. with her cousin and stayed with me for a month. She was doing an art project and convinced her school that doing this artwork in the U.S. was the way to go. In 2016, Wendy went to language school in France. I checked in again with her in 2018 and found out she has two more years to go and one day, I hope to see her again. From this young, shy girl to an artist all grown up.

The five day tri-annual 2019 Council On Legislation concluded in Chicago on Thursday 18, April. There were a total of 117 proposed Enactments submitted which were all seeking to change either Rotary International's Constitution or Bylaws or the Standard Club Constitution.

### Report of Action

I'm pleased to provide you with the Report of Action. In this report, you will find:

- A letter from General Secretary Hewko
- Legislation that was adopted at the Council, including amended legislation
- Vote tallies for the adopted items
- An Opposition to Legislation Report Form

A copy of this report has also being sent to club secretaries, governors and Rotary senior leaders. Clubs may use the opposition form if they disagree with an adopted enactment or position statement. Completed forms must reach Council Services by 1 August 2019. More information about this form can be found in General Secretary Hewko's letter.

The updated constitutional documents will be published in English by 18 June 2019. The updated Manual of Procedure will be published in English by October 2019, with other languages to follow.

As another reminder, the deadline to submit Resolutions to the Council on Resolutions is quickly approaching - 30, June 2019! The Council on Resolutions meets online every year to vote on proposed resolutions. Resolutions are requests to the Board or the Trustees to take an action that is outside the purview of the constitutional documents. Ideally, a resolution should affect the Rotary world, rather than address local or administrative issues.

Representatives from each of the 535 Rotary districts vote on resolutions proposed by clubs, districts, the RI Board, and the general council or conference of RIBI. However, a Resolution proposed by a Club must also be voted on, or endorsed by the Clubs in the District at its District Conference, a District Legislative Meeting or a ballot-by-mail before it can be submitted to Rotary. Adopted resolutions are then considered by the RI Board or The Rotary Foundation Trustees.

The Council on Resolutions will take place 15 October through 15 November, 2019. You can view resolutions beginning 1 October. Voting will close 15 November at 23:59 Chicago time (UTC-6). The results will be published by 20 November. Any Rotarian can view the resolutions and the results, but only representatives can vote.
