CALL TO SERVICE FROM PP ART LONG

As the Sponsor Liaison for our club and BSA Troop 78 Girls, we have received a request for assistance for providing volunteers to support trained scouts in conducting the 2019 SCOUT-O-RAMA that will be held at Italian Picnic Grounds in Sutter Creek on Saturday, August 24th.
