### Member Memo:

There are a couple new items that I should have brought up at last Tuesday's regular meeting.

### **KENNEDY MINE PROJECTS**

On October 11, 2019, President Rick and I visited the Kennedy Mine property to look at several projects that they would like us to consider at the Visitors Center. There were six (6) we looked at and presented to the Board last Tuesday. Unfortunately, our current available funds are too low to consider doing them all this year. There was one however that the Board felt comfortable with.

At the rear entrance to the visitors Center there is a brick paved walkway (approximately 19 ft. x 12 ft.) that over the years has become a tripping hazard. The project would be done in two parts. First, we would harvest old bricks from several locations on the property assuring there are a sufficient supply of usable old bricks. We will have access to the property during week days to harvest bricks. Then, we would remove the current bricks, dig down 6 to 8 inches to native soil and level the surface. We will then fill the dug-out area with sand or other like material, compact and level it. Next, we will replace the bricks to grade. Then, sand will swept into the seams between the bricks and vibrated to stabilize the new surface and provide a smooth walking surface. Materials are roughly estimated to be approximately \$1,200. Feel free to discuss your questions or concerns with me, Rick or any Board member.

### JACKSON GATEWAY SIGN PROJECT

A possible new project has come to light this past week. The Jackson Gateway sign at S/R 49 and Scottsville has rotted and collapsed. We have been asked if our Rotary Club would like to take on the task of designing a new one and replacing it.

As many of you remember, we and the City of Jackson, replaced the Gateway sign near the north city limits in 2015 at an estimated cost of \$3,170, with \$1000 committed by Jackson Rotary. The sign needing replacement is not as big a project as the one we replaced. This new location is much more confined and will not accommodate a sign as big as the first one.

The Board was made aware of the collapsed sign at the last Board meeting. No action was taken until we got a feeling from the membership as to your willingness to take on the project. We cannot estimate the cost until we have a concept design, but for discussion, I would guess that the cost would be about \$1,500. Please make your thoughts or concerns known to any member of the Board.

### TRIVIA CHALLENGE

March 7<sup>th</sup> will be the date for the next Trivia Challenge. This will mark our 5<sup>th</sup> year using the Challenge as a source for raising funds for Rotary Youth Leadership Awakening, (RYLA). It will also be the third year we have held the event at the Highway House Banquet Room. The cost to send one student is almost \$900.

We will all need to participate in conducting and selling out the 30 tables reserved for the teams. Each 4 person team will pay a \$100 entry fee which, if we sell out, the \$3,000 entry fees will only cover 3 RYLA students and that's only if the prize money is returned. The no host bar will produce about \$500 to \$700. The entry fee includes the food table.

So, what I'm asking you to do is think of ways we can increase our cash return from producing the event. We will be sending at least 6 students to camp this year. Please make me aware of your ideas either buy email, text or in person. Your ideas could be the answer to making the event fully fund our 6 RYLA students.
