August 6th program highlights

Tim Dake Guyana

Tim first challenged us to understand where Guyana was. It is in South America. It was British Guyana next to Dutch Guyana (now Suriname) and French Guiana. 1970 became the Republic of Guyana. Six items known for – Sugar, Rum, Gold, Boxide, Timber and Rice. Tim was there for the gold. Tim worked out in the bush. Supplies to the gold mine were barged up a delta and river for 6 hours to the Guyan Goldfields. It is 70 miles inland from Buckhall. 400 people at the mine site Aurora Mine. Tim shared fascinating pictures of roads and bridges and stories of his time working.

July 30th program highlights

Tim Dyhr – Nevada Copper

Construction on underground mine nearing steady state operation. Expect production to begin in 4th quarter 2019. Feasibility studies continue on open pit mines. Expect 400 full time workers for underground and 700 for open pits.

Pumpkin Hollow is utilizing many new methods for good stewardship in mining. The tailing method is called Tall Stack. They are filtered with water removed and recycled. 20% of the tailings return underground as they mine from the bottom up. The main shaft is cement lined. They have 30 ton trucks running underground.

Nevada Copper has a community advisory council to continue to hear and share feedback with the local community. They have a large workforce development plan. They will provide training for underground mining. Current workers are contractors with Phoenix Industrial.
