Rotarians met at the new Yerington City Hall and received a personal tour of administrative offices from Mayor John Garry. John spoke to our group on how the city was able to procure this wonderful space. The old city hall was only 1000 square feet and was built in the 1920's. Inquiries for the Armory were begun in May of 2019. Thru the slow process of government the city finally acquired the full facility. The benefit of slow moving was the military mortgage was paid down to just \$223K which is all the city needed to pay to acquire the facility. There is a large community room which will be available for community rental. City maintenance is very happy with the tank sized facilities to maintain vehicles.

The facility will be named after Major General Robert T. Herbert. The community will be invited to the grand opening ceremonies where we will hear about the Major General.
