With that her theme is Find the Rotary JOurneY. What is the JOY in the journey? Berta challenged Jan to have a program all about “How has Rotary Changed Lives? Ours and others.”

Berta passed around a large container of M&Ms representative of Make Membership Meaningful. Our district covers 96,000 square miles with 56 clubs.
