## Advocacy and Accompaniment

- Advocacy and Accompaniment through medical and legal processes
  - Accompaniment to the hospital after a domestic violence or sexual assault incident
  - Accompaniment to court for any cases relating to domestic violence, sexual assault or child abuse
  - Advocacy on behalf of the client to local organizations who may be involved in his/her case



## Support Groups and Counseling

- Support Groups
  - Women's English speaking
  - Women's Spanish speaking
  - Adults Molested as Children
- Counseling
  - Drop in peer counseling
  - One on one counseling by appt.
  - Available for victims and their families



## Legal Assistance

- Representation available for individuals who have had issues with domestic violence (stalking), sexual assault, or child abuse
- This most often involves cases of divorce, custody, and restraining orders
- Legal assistance is a free program



#### Parent to Parent

- Supervised visits
- Monitored exchanges
- Most often court ordered



### **Batterers Intervention Program**

- Certified in CA and NV
- Classes for men and women (separate)
- Classes are typically ordered on a 12, 26, or 52 week basis
- May also be voluntary



## Shelter/Housing Program

- Emergency motel nights
- Shelter Serenity House
- Transitional Housing
- Shelter:
  - 90 day program
  - Life skills coaching
  - Counseling and support groups



#### Prevention and Outreach

- Child Abuse Prevention
- Rape Prevention Education
- Mandated Reporter Training
- Crisis Counseling Training
- Community education
- Community presence/involvement



#### Goals

- Maintain current services
- Provide services that touch on all aspects of the cycle of violence
  - Engaging Men
- Increase prevention efforts with hopes to lower occurrences of violence
  - Youth groups
- Further develop relationships with local agencies



#### LVF Statistics

- In 2011 our agency provided services to almost 2000 people
- 73% female
- 27% male
- 25% children
- Over the last 3 years, on average 35% of our DV services were provided for children, 36% of SA services were for children, and 23% of basic needs services were for children



#### Harsh Truths

- Domestic violence crosses ALL boundaries, regardless of ethnicity, gender, age, or socioeconomic status
- One in 3 women have experienced some form of abuse in their lifetime
- On average, more than 3 women and I man are murdered by their intimate partner everyday in the U.S.
- Every 2 minutes, someone in the U.S. is sexually assaulted.
- I in 5 high school students reports being abused in some way by a boyfriend or girlfriend
- Health care related costs of domestic violence exceed
  5.8 billion dollars a year
