Last Week's News



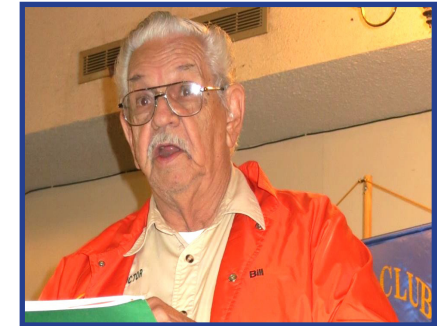

Kellerman's latest project has been the construction of a nursing school with the help of a Rotary Global Grant through District 5190 and the Rotary Club of Reno.



The Bwindi nursing school opened in November 2013. It is the only RN-level nursing school for a population of approximately one million. Nurses trained here will be able to work independently in villages throughout this remote region, greatly improving health care to an underserved population.
