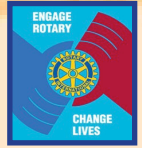

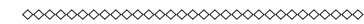

Peace among nations is not impossible of attainment; they can find peace if they will.”

International Service

International Service is one of the most rewarding of Rotary’s Avenues of Service. It can provide opportunities for cultural exchange, for working with international partners, and for both small-scale hands-on projects and major multi-year projects. Service projects can be modest in scope or major undertakings, such as installing modern water and sanitation systems or creating health facilities. Projects can provide a few books to a small village school or address major issues, such as literacy or disease eradication, on a much larger, regional basis. Whether small or large, one of the keys to a successful and sustainable international project is involving the people who will benefit from the project and working with partners in other countries.
