

Last Week



Oliver Grosz presented a Michael Josephson video on ethics at last week's meeting. Josephson spoke about ethical relativism (what society decides) and universal ethics (Rotary's 4-way test) and highlighted the six pillars of character:

- -trustworthiness
- -respect
- -responsibility
- -fairness
- -caring
- -good citizenship

Josephson suggested that we should filter questions through these six items in making decisions.
