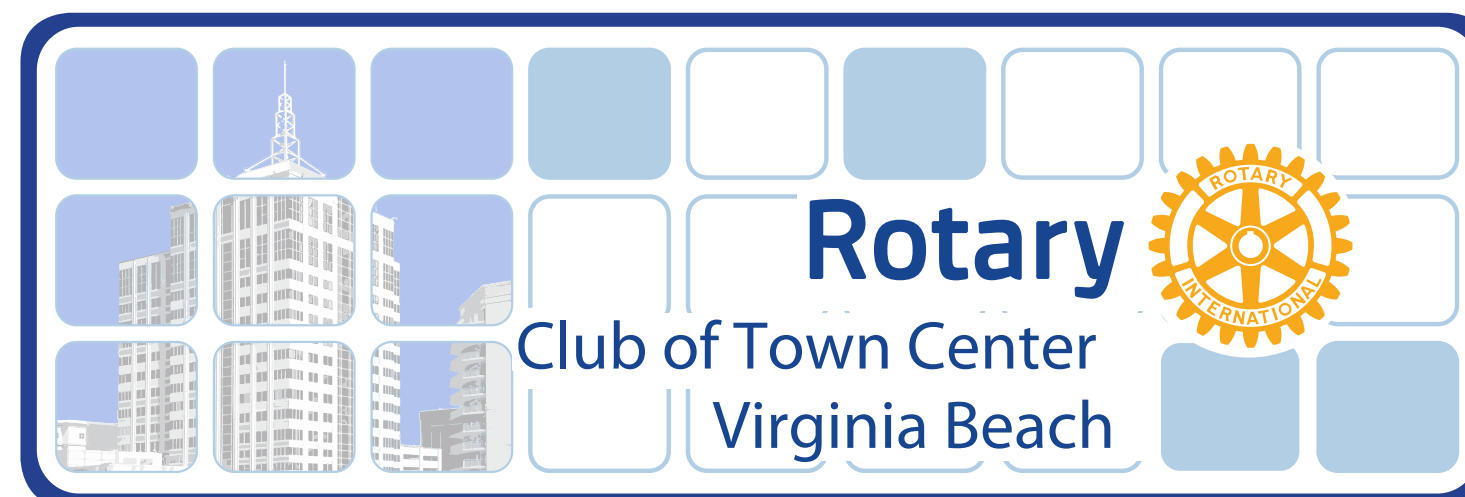
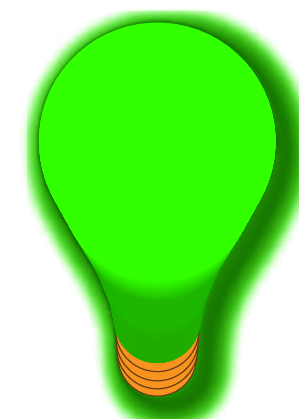

November is Rotary Foundation Month

*The Rotary Foundation transforms your gifts into service projects
 that change lives both close to home and around the world*

At the 1917 convention, outgoing Rotary president Arch Klumph proposed setting up an endowment "for the purpose of doing good in the world."
 That one idea, and an initial contribution of \$26.50, set in motion a powerful force that has transformed millions of lives around the globe.

100 Years of Doing Good in the World

Arch Klumph's idea for an endowment fund dedicated to "doing good in the world" planted the seed of The Rotary Foundation in 1917. Thanks to his vision and staunch advocacy, and the extraordinary generosity of Rotary members worldwide, that fund has become one of the world's leading humanitarian foundations.

- 1917 Rotary President Arch Klumph proposes an endowment for doing good
- 1928 The Rotary Foundation is formally named
- 1930 The Foundation awards \$500 to the International Society for Crippled Children
- 1936 Institutes for International Understanding illuminate global issues
- 1947 Rotary members contribute \$1.3 million in Paul Harris memory
- 1957 Paul Harris Fellow recognition begins
- 1963 Matched Districts program is established
- 1965 Matching Grants Program is launched
- 1978 Health, Hunger and Humanity (3-H) grants expand service efforts

- 1979 Rotary begins "Immunizing 6 Million Children in the Philippines Against Polio"
- 1980 Rotary commits to "Eliminate Polio Through Immunization"
- 1981 Rotary Foundation establishes the Endowment Fund
- 1985 The PolioPlus program is launched
- 1988 The multiyear PolioPlus campaign raises almost \$247 million
- 1995 The PolioPlus Partners program is created to support National Immunization Days
- 1999 The Rotary Peace Centers are founded
- 2004 The Every Rotarian, Every Year initiative is created
- 2007 The Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation issues \$100 million challenge
- 2009 Rotary and USAID launch the International H2O Collaboration
- 2013 Simplified grant model goes into effect
- 2015 Through decades of commitment and ceaseless work by Rotary and our partners, polio cases worldwide are down by 99.9 per cent since GEPI was launched in 1988
- 2016 The Foundation's Centennial Year begins on July 1

This mission is accomplished in the following ways.

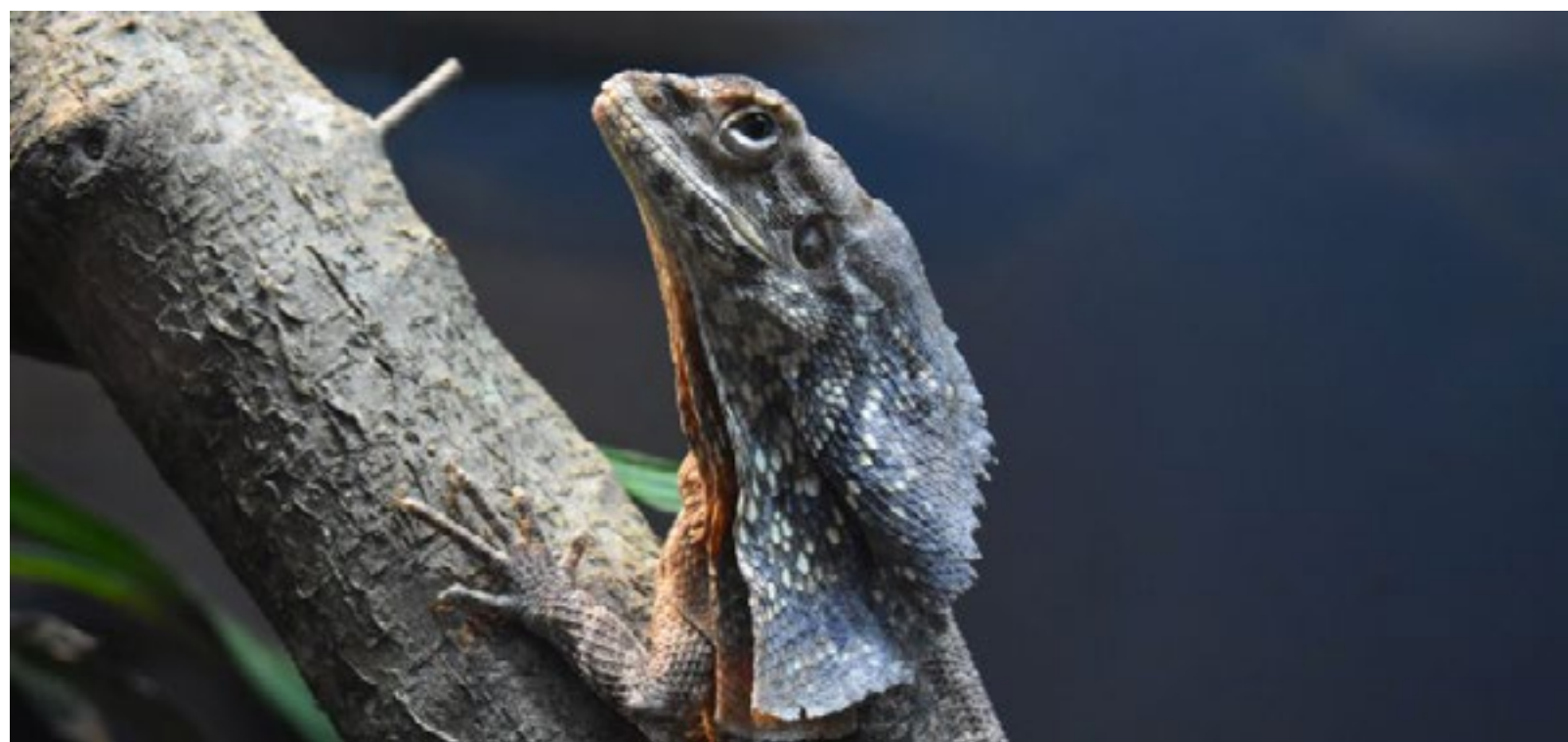
- By demonstrating leadership in wildlife conservation and animal welfare.
- Providing a broad audience with outstanding and unique educational opportunities that lead to the appreciation and stewardship of nature.
- Inspiring and serving our community with engaging, meaningful, safe and memorable experiences.
- Providing innovative zoological facilities for events and programs that contribute to the region's economic vitality.
- By demonstrating organizational excellence consistent with a commitment to outstanding service, progressive resource management and environmental leadership.

A Hybrid Organization

The Virginia Zoo functions as a true hybrid operation through the joint efforts and constant communication between the staffs of the Virginia Zoological Park (VZP) and the Virginia Zoological Society (VZS). VZP staff maintains all animal exhibits and provides animal care and husbandry, maintains the lush grounds and gardens, oversees most building repair and maintenance, and manages the Zoo's ticket booth.

VZS staff operates the Zoo's gift shop, restaurant and concessions, educational programs, special events and parties, membership program, marketing and promotions, and fundraising and grant writing through the private sector.

The staffs of both organizations work side-by-side on a daily basis and the operation of the two organizations are not only closely related and complementary, but are mostly indistinguishable.
