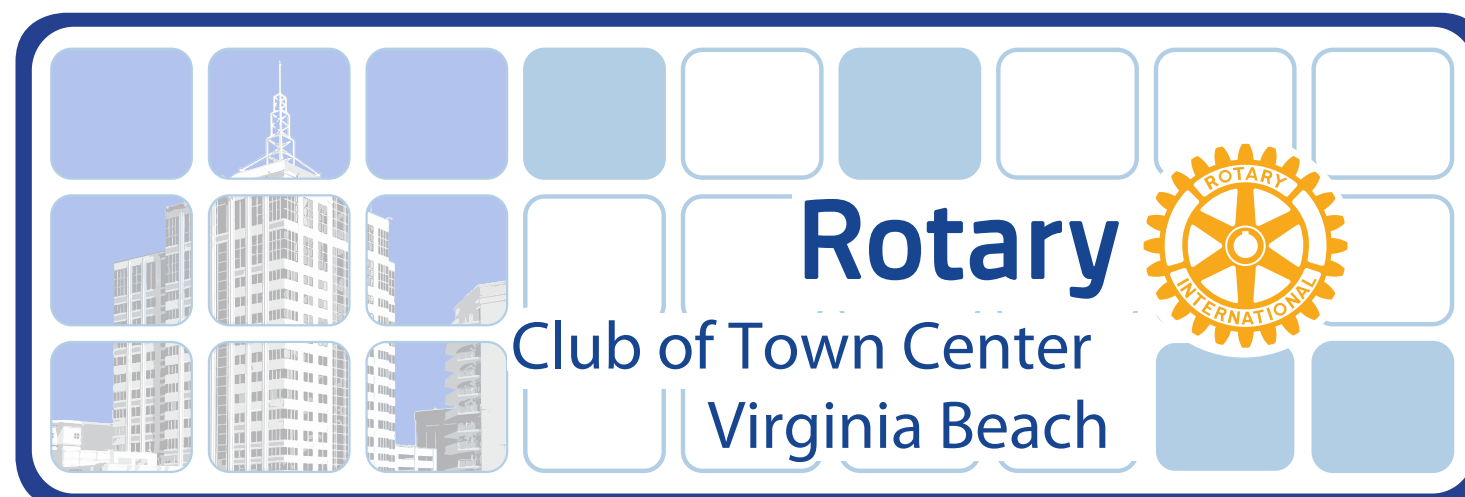
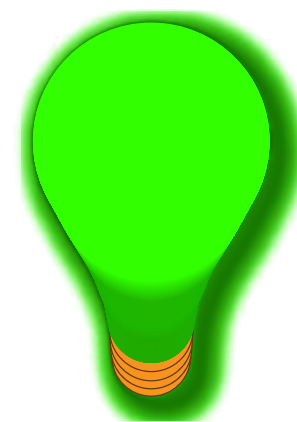

Inspired by the Reinheitsgebot of 1516, the Gordon Biersch experience rests upon the foundations of purity, simplicity and precision.

Our philosophy is most recognizable in our selection of authentic German lagers, each crafted on-site using only malted barley, hops, yeast and pure, filtered water. This same dedication extends to our kitchen, where our chefs create fresh dishes that perfectly balance comfort and excitement.

How It All Began

What began over twenty years ago as a dream of bringing together fresh, handcrafted beer and made-from-scratch, world class cuisine - is today a reality at Gordon Biersch Brewery Restaurants from coast to coast and across the Pacific to Hawaii and Taiwan.

This dream of exceptional beer and delicious food became a reality on July 6, 1988 when the first Gordon Biersch opened in Palo Alto, California. Acquired by Big River Brewing Company in 1999, Gordon Biersch currently operates 35 restaurants in the United States, including Honolulu, Hawaii. Additionally, four Gordon Biersch Brewery Restaurants operate in Taiwan.

The Gordon Biersch heritage of superior beer, great food and good times are now being served up fresh daily.

How we brew our pure, German lagers

1. Weighing and milling of the malt: The kernels are cracked, maintaining coarseness of the husk while pulverizing the flour.
2. Holding and transferring: The milled malt is held in the grist hopper for transfer to the mash tun.
3. Mashing: Heating the cracked malt with water for programmed times at specified temperatures.
4. Lautering: Separating the liquid (sweet wort) from the solid matter.
5. Boiling: Boiling the sweet wort with hops.
6. Cooling: Cooling the hopped wort.
7. Primary Fermentation: The cold, hopped wort is held at 9°C for 7-9 days. The yeast converts the extract into alcohol and carbon dioxide.
8. Secondary fermentation: This aging process, also referred to as lagering, occurs at near freezing temperatures over a period of 4-6 weeks. By products of the primary fermentation are gradually broken down. The beer is held under pressure and natural carbonation occurs.
9. Filtration: Any yeast remaining in suspension is removed.
10. Dispensing: The beer is tapped from serving vessels.

FESTBIER	IBU 23	ABV 5.9%
A Gordon Biersch classic! Honey colored lager with slightly sweet toasted maltiness, balanced by the subtle spice of German Hersbrucker hops.		
MÄRZEN	IBU 18	ABV 5.7%
A Gordon Biersch classic. This is an original Oktoberfest style lager. It is an extremely smooth, auburn colored Bavarian lager with a mildly sweet Munich Malt finish.
