Cambodian Embassy Hosts Rotaract Fundraiser for Demining Activities

DG Rich Carson to Represent Rotary at the OAS

This February, **Dong Kurn Lee, RI President-elect appointed DG Rich Carson** to be the Rotary representative to the Organization of American States (OAS), for 2008-2009.

This one year appointment has as its major objective enhancing Rotary's visibility in the international community – particularly in the Americas. There are options for two one-year extensions to the appointment; however, it is not automatic.

"I will establish effective communications with all levels of the OAS; create synergy to increase the effectiveness of Rotary programs within the OAS countries; establish friendship exchanges between different Rotary clubs and Districts within the OAS area to define service projects which can be accomplished on a joint basis; and establish blue ribbon committees to assist in all of these efforts. Since the OAS headquarters located in D.C., I will, in a sense, be one of Rotary's people in Washington," Carson said of his appointment.

"I will participate in training and orientation in Evanston along with all of Rotary's other reps to international organizations."
