around the world. His family is from Oberlungwitz and in the 19 years since the unification of Germany there is still a lot of tension. East Germany's industry had been rundown and there was high unemployment, but they don't want to be a "beggar" to West Germany. Albrecht's presentation included photos from Dresden, Heidelberg, Munich and Berlin. There are Rotary Clubs in East Germany and new clubs are growing. Steve Naron provided the photos of Albrecht at the Naval Academy, having crabs and steamers at Mike's on the bay, and at John Brown's "fort" in Harpers Ferry. They also visited Mount Vernon, the Pentagon memorial, and biked and kayaked along the C&O trail. Albrecht has rented a car for 56 days and is touring the United States coast-to-coast. Message From The Rotary Foundation Chair – New Opportunities For The Foundation

Dear family of Rotary,
Although The Rotary Foundation has faced considerable challenges in 2008-09, I am encouraged by the many positive events of recent months.

In January, we started the application process for the Future Vision Plan pilot. The Trustees are reviewing the applications and will announce the pilot districts this month. We are pleased to see that a large number of districts are eager to help us test this simplified and focused approach to grant-making.

Also in January, Bill Gates appeared at our International Assembly and announced that the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation had awarded Rotary another grant for polio eradication – this one for US\$255 million – in addition to the \$100 million grant awarded in 2007. On the same day, we learned that the governments of Germany and the United Kingdom have committed \$130 million and \$150 million, respectively, to eradicating polio.

Rotarians are, of course, doing their part to respond to what is now Rotary's US\$200 Million Challenge. To date, we are more than one-third of the way toward meeting the challenge, and I have no doubt that we will surpass our goal by the deadline of 30 June 2012. We can and will **End Polio Now**.

In March, we announced an exciting alliance with USAID. Through our International H₂O Collaboration, we will be developing large-scale water and sanitation projects in countries with active Rotary clubs and a strong USAID presence. This partnership and its projects should serve as a model for the Rotary Foundation Global Grant projects that will be developed under the Future Vision Plan.

Despite the current economic challenges, The Rotary Foundation remains strong. With the support of Rotarians and the organizations that have chosen to work with us, our Foundation will continue to be a vital force for good in our troubled world.

In Memoriam: Walter Frey Father of District Governor Elect Paul Frey



Mr. Walter Erwin "Walt" Frey, Chief Warrant Officer W4, 86 of Frederick died Wednesday, May 13 at the Frederick Memorial Hospital. He was the husband of Jean Paula Schoen Frey, whom he married December 15, 1946.

Born December 12,

1922 in Koenigsburg, Germany, he was a son of the late Walter Rudolph and Elizabeth Fabritz Frey.

Mr. Frey served as an Infantryman with the 89th Infantry Division during World War II and earned the European-African-Middle Eastern Campaign Medal, World War II Victory Medal, Bronze Star Medal and Combat Infantryman's Badge. Mr. Frey was later commissioned as a Warrant Officer in the Counter-Intelligence Corps and served in the United States and throughout Germany, ultimately retiring in 1970 with 26 years of active service in the Army. Upon retirement from the Army, Mr. Frey went to work for Maryland Social Services for 15 years. Additionally, Mr. Frey was a stalwart volunteer in the community, judging YMCA diving competitions, umpiring for countless Little League baseball games, assisting as a Girl Scout Leader, volunteering at Fort Detrick, and serving as a member of the Volunteer Police Uniformed Auxiliary. He was also a member of the F.S.K. Post #11 American Legion and the Northeast Chapter of Counter Intelligence Corps Association.

Surviving besides his wife are nine children: Patricia A. Borja and husband Tony of Derwood MD, Chief Master Sergeant Christopher W. Frey and wife Sandra of Warner Robins Air Force Base, GA, Catherine Calloway and husband Jay of Chrystal Beach, FL, Lieutenant Colonel (ret) Neil J. Frey and wife Holly of Lansing, KS, Margarete DeSoleil of Missoula, MT, Constance Chappellear and husband Walter of Columbus OH, Paul Frey and wife Laurie of Frederick, MD, Matthew Frey and partner Mike Gatty of

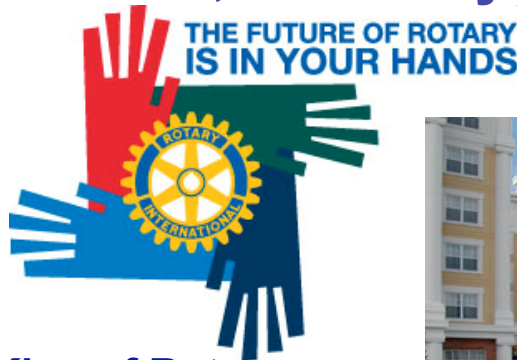
