Annual Fund Giving 2015-2016

The Annual Fund giving for District 6840 is down for the current Rotary year; \$62,566 as compared to \$78,771 for the same time last year. Now is the time to make your donations to The Rotary Foundation to get your tax deductions for 2015. Half of your contributions come back to the district in three years in the form of District Designated Funds (DDF). DDF is what funds your local club projects in the form of District Grants. DDF also funds major international projects that our district participates in, such as mammography vans in India, Lunches for Learning in Honduras, water tanks in Mexico, and sanitation networks in Egypt.

Only 28 of our district's 52 clubs have made any contributions to the Annual Fund this year. Only 17 of those 52 clubs have submitted Annual Fund goals to rotary.org. Four clubs have already exceeded the yearly \$100 per capita goal for the district:

Covington \$259.17 Annual Fund per capita

West Bank \$141.33 Algiers \$130.00 NO Riverbend \$125.00

ROTARY YOUTH EXCHANGE TRAINING AT MID-YEAR CHECK-UP SPECIAL OPPORTUNITY FOR INTERACT SPONSORS and NEW CLUB YOUTH EXCHANGE OFFICERS

District 6840 Youth Exchange will hold a training session about how to manage Rotary Youth Exchange at the Club Level in a session concurrent with the Mid Year Check up on Saturday, January 9.

Participants should arrive by 9am and plan to stay through noon. Rotarians should register on-line using the District site.

We ask that all clubs select a Youth Exchange Officer to represent the club at this session. We will answer "All Things Youth Exchange" and help arm your clubs with what you need to begin to recruit students from your communities to apply as Rotary Goodwill Ambassadors and win the Rotary Youth Exchange Scholarship to spend one high school year abroad.

The District RYE Committee does not have the capacity to reach directly into high schools -- this must be done at the Club level. However, we will open this training session up to Interact Club Sponsors in addition to Club Youth Exchange Officers. *Please reach out directly to the high school sponsor or your Interact Clubs and invite them to the January 9 session*. As a collection of communities, we need to increase knowledge about the Rotary Youth Exchange Scholarship within our schools so the students of Mississippi and Louisiana can participate in this incredible program.
