Local man in need: \$299 to order lightweight wheelchair.

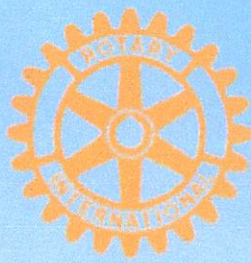

Keynote Speaker | Steven Bucci

Do you want to grow your organization? Do you want to attract high potential young members? Do you want to keep members and see them grow within your organization?

You need to learn, adopt, and live **Sacrificial Leadership**. Young people today are hungry to learn leadership. They want to see it in action. They want to be brought into high performing organizations, coached and mentored, given trust and confidence, and led down the path to future success.

It can be done. It doesn't take new concepts, just the correct applications of principles you probably already know. It takes time, some willingness to risk, and it takes compassion for your people.
