Rotary International project highlight:

In many parts of the world, poverty, illiteracy, innumeracy, and natural disasters that destroy crops or homes can leave rural villagers vulnerable to debt bondage. When people don't have enough to eat, and they barely have the ability to keep a roof over their head and their family quite literally alive, they will often turn to whatever means are possible for survival. Families may seek an arrangement with a business owner, who asks them to sign a contract that they can't read and understand, and they inadvertently trade their freedom for survival. Schools4Freedom brings entire villiages to freedom by educating children and teaching everyone about their rights. At our schools in northern India, children are taught to use the legal system to fight their slave owners and free themselves forever.
