Rotary Learning Centre

Many online courses have been added to the Learning Centre. Update your website to make sure your members have access to courses that are important to your district's learning strategy. Most of the Lead Your Club and Lead Your District manuals have already been replaced with learning plans — a series of courses — specific to each role. These plans include Club President Basics, District Committee Basics, and District Training Committee Intermediate. The Lead Your Club: President manual still exists, but most of the Lead Your District manuals will be replaced by July.

New In the Learning Centre:

Rotary Foundation Basics. This course has been updated and includes a new quiz to test your knowledge.

Leadership Basics. This course from Toastmasters International focuses on essential leadership skills and is now available in several languages.

Leading a Team. This Toastmasters International course focuses on leading a small team and is now available in several languages.

Rotary's Action Plan and You. This course shows you how your club can make a greater impact and implement other facets of the Action Plan. It's now available in several languages.

Get Ready: District International Service Committee. This course shows the committee's role in connecting members with resources to carry out sustainable service projects.

Presidential conferences showcase

Rotaract - RI President Holger Knaack will hold three virtual presidential conferences that will showcase the leadership of Rotaract members and collaboration between Rotaract and Rotary around the world. Knaack said he chose to focus on Rotaract leaders because young people have the potential to reshape our organization: "The COVID-19 epidemic has made clear that we are living in a different world, a world dominated by young people with the foresight and drive to take advantage of rapid change." The three events will be hosted from Brazil, 15-16 January; Nigeria, 22-24 January; and the United States, 14-16 May.

Distribution of the Centenary of Rotary in Australia – 1921-2021 Commemorative Book

The Rotary International Zone 8 History and Archives Committee is nearing completion of a 350 plus page, quality, printed in colour, hard covered book to mark the Centenary of Rotary in Australia on April 21, 2021. Current indications are that the book will be printed in March 2021 to be available for distribution in early April. SOCKIN' GREAT TIME TO BE HAD!

The Rotary Club of Port Macquaire West are embarking on ambitious project to mark the centenary of Rotary in Australia and is seeking your help!

On 17 May 2014, a group of about 30 young adults in Germany completed the building of a washing line 6.066 kilometres long with 69,152 socks pegged to it and set a new Guinness World Record. That record still stands but not for much longer!

Port Macquarie, NSW, Australia is where this record will be smashed in 2021. The challenge is being led by Rotary (we are deliberately not using our club name) and, as far as we know, it is the only major event in our District 9650 that is a celebration of 100 years of Rotary in Australia. DG Debbie Loveday loves it!

Sovereign Hills (part of the Lewis Land Group) is the major local sponsor (up to \$30,000) and the site of the challenge is adjacent to the new Sovereign Place Shopping Centre in the heart of the Sovereign Hills residential and commercial development precinct (see attached aerial view), a fast-developing suburb on the western outskirts of Port Macquarie. Rotary aims to build a washing line TEN kilometres long with over 100,000 socks pegged to it.

We are engaging ten sponsors (up to \$5,000 each) – one for each of the 1.0 kilometre sections of washing line. We'll be appealing to our Port Macquarie Hastings community to not only donate their unwanted/tired/lonely socks but also whatever money they can afford to help these four not-for-profits. We want to be able to say to our community that each dollar donated is being matched by a dollar from our major sponsor and our ten line sponsors (i.e. 10 cents from each of the 10 line sponsors). We are appealing to all of our D9650 clubs to help us smash this Guinness World Record and give our public-at-large a different view of what Rotary takes on. Let's show them that we're not just about raffles, barbecues, book sales, building public amenities ... which is what most people see.

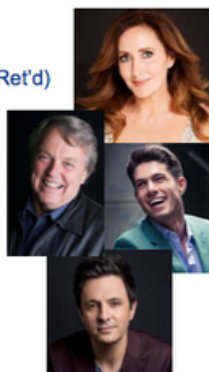
