The Rotary Foundation – April 2021 World Reporting Analysis for District 9650

Thank you to everyone who is participating in a global grant for keeping your reports up to date. I received this email from the Stewardship sector of Foundation.

On behalf of the Trustees, thank you for participating in The Rotary Foundation (TRF) grants programs to serve communities in need. I am writing to update you on the world reporting analysis conducted in April 2021. The analysis is performed on a quarterly basis to track each district's compliance with reporting requirements for Rotary Foundation grant projects.

I am happy to inform you that District 9650 was 100% up-to-date with reporting requirements for grants sponsored by the district and its clubs as of the April 2021 analysis. The Trustees rely on district leaders to ensure that stewardship guidelines are being upheld worldwide and they thank you for your efforts. We recognize the hard work involved to maintain this level of compliance and encourage your district and its clubs to continue your good work. At the time the analysis was conducted, District 9650 had 4 grants in paid, funded, and reported status. Well done everyone concerned. It is important that we do the right thing so as to not compromise any future Global Grant applications.

Rotary Youth Exchange

On 19 March the Board of Directors of Rotary International met to discuss Rotary Youth Exchange and the continuing impact of the COVID-19 pandemic. President Holger issued a letter to leaders shortly following the meeting to announce their difficult and saddening decision to suspend Rotary Youth Exchange in-person exchanges until 1 July 2022. The Board considered feedback from the discussion with the Rotary Presidents and Youth Exchange leaders, your emails and letters, and recommendations from the Pandemic Task Force. Although we know this is disappointing for so many of you, we as your staff team will be here to support you in the year ahead as you prepare to resume exchanges.

Crisis management plans

As stated by RI's Board of Directors in 2020, districts must now have a crisis management plan (CMP), in order to comply with certification requirements. The original deadline for a CMP to be implemented was 1 July 2021. However, given the Board's most recent decision, **the deadline has been extended to 1 July 2022**.

All types of in-person exchanges (long-term, short-term, inter-state, inter-country, etc.) are not permitted per the Board's decision. In accordance with Rotary's youth protection policies for unauthorized exchange activity, any district found to be participating in any exchange activity contrary to this guidance will have its certification to participate in Rotary Youth Exchange suspended for a period of two years. Any activity that puts students at risk will have serious repercussions.

2021-22 annual certification renewal mailing

At the beginning of May 2021, all governors-elect will receive the 2021-22 annual certification mailing. Although the RYE program will be suspended for the 2021-22 Rotary year, governors-elect must renew their district's certification in order to remain certified. As you know, exchanges cannot be planned without being certified. Renewing your district's certification ensures that you can plan exchanges for the 2022-23 Rotary year, and that your district team will be trained, prepared, and committed to youth protection and safety.

World Immunization Week is 24-30 April - Join with Rotary to promote the power of vaccines During World Immunization Week, 24-30 April, join with Rotary to combat vaccine hesitancy and misinformation by spreading the facts about why #VaccinesWork.

With decades of experience fighting polio, Rotary plays a key role in informing people about the power and effectiveness of vaccines. As COVID-19 vaccines become more available, Rotary members are using our experience in fighting polio to help communities with their vaccination education and organization efforts. And today, because we and our partners have worked so hard, wild poliovirus remains endemic in only two countries: Afghanistan and Pakistan. But to eradicate it there and to prevent a resurgence in other parts of the world, we must continue to build trust in vaccines and raise funds for polio eradication, including vaccine delivery.

This year, you can take action for World Immunization Week in three easy ways:

- 1. Download and share our new two-minute video, "Rotary Inspires Leaders in Global Health," and show it to your clubs. In it, global health leaders like U.S. infectious disease expert Dr. Anthony Fauci, Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation Co-Chair Bill Gates, UNICEF Executive Director Henrietta H. Fore, and World Health Organization Director-General Dr. Tedros Adhanom Ghebreyesus talk about what Rotary has achieved in the fight to end polio.
- 2. Post graphics and other content from Rotary's World Immunization Week Toolkit on social media with the hashtags #EndPolio and #VaccinesWork.
- 3. Donate to Rotary's PolioPlus Fund to help us and our partners deliver polio vaccines to vulnerable children. Your contribution will be tripled, thanks to the Gates Foundation.

Almost 1 million members in 158 countries are awesome statistics, but they really mean nothing at all unless the members are inspired by Rotary's challenging philosophy, expressed by its splendidly simple motto "Service Above Self". The motto would be irrelevant if there were no selfishness in the world, but the temptation to cheat, to exploit and to dominate for the sake of personal wealth and power has always been a feature of human existence and the chances are that it always will be.

that it always will be. The significance of Rotary is that it has become one of the most active and effective lay forces on the side of righteousness, cooperation and goodwill. It provides, therefore, a most powerful encouragement of the potential for good that is in all men and by so doing it also acts as a sever restraint on what is evil and corrupt. It is no coincidence that Rotary flourishes in the free and open societies of this world while it is ruthlessly suppressed under ideological dictatorships.

This book may not be the only history of Rotary to be written but it is probably the first to trace the course of events and to follow the development of an idea at the same time. What comes through is that while fashions and attitudes may vary between countries and over periods of time, the central principle and philosophy of Rotary runs through the whole story as if it were the track of the Golden Wheel.
