The money raised will all be going to Stewart House, a children's charity that offers over 1,700 public school children the opportunity to attend a safe haven next to Curl Curl beach in Manly at no cost to the parents or guardians. Children participate in educational programs and excursions designed to develop their social and emotional skills, build self-esteem and improve their overall well-being. This experience provides children with a much-needed break from their current circumstances.
