The club has been at the coalface of drought and bushfire relief in our area. Community service has included tools for the Upper Macleay, BBQ's trailer raffle. One of the things they supported was Rubicon Australia who have the unenviable job of supporting owners who have lost everything from bushfire by going through the remain of the properties and sifting for anything left of sentimental and financial value. The club has been successful in gaining grants to support local community needs and is famous for their home library service. 
During the pandemic, our work has changed but our mission has not.
