The background to both photos shows the drought impact on "Stirling" typical of the country I have seen around Inverell and east of Guyra.

In most of our selected area calendar year annual rainfall is less than a guarter of normal (average of records).

Alan unloaded the rear trailer of the road train whilst Greg and I unloaded the front trailer at another farm 8km away. We met this family briefly but they could not stay to unload as they were travelling to a funeral. Alan wasted no time getting hay to his cattle with 5 bales fed-out before we got back from the other farm.
