Both gentlemen have played a pivotal role in their local area and have been an inspiration to Rotarians and community members.

District also recognised the work of PDG Maurie Stack OAM as the driving force behind the Bushfire Recovery projects in the Manning Valley and other humanitarian projects around the globe.

During the Changeover MC Bruce George, AG Cluster 8 and President of the Inverell Club, mentioned how his Club responded to my goal: each Club commence a new community project.

To quote an email from Bruce: Your challenge of Clubs finding a community project has resulted in us taking on updating a shelter in a park that was built by our Club about 35 years ago.

Peter Bannon joined the Rotary Club of Armidale AM on June 1, 1991, in the year the club was chartered.

He was а much loved member who punched well weight in above his volunteer hours, despite his



disability. He was also a great community member; a Justice of the Peace, and was awarded 'Citizen of the Year' by Council.

Assisted by all the Rotary clubs in Armidale, he headed a group to bring Camp Quality to Armidale for the first time.



A former Naval Chief Petty Officer. Peter saw service Vietnam, and in was resplendent in uniform each Anzac Day. He also led the TS Armidale for a number of years.

A car accident in 1975 left Peter in a wheelchair. He often called himself 'the man who brought his own chair'. He started а business called 'The Rope

Bloke' where he was able to use his skills with rope from his Navy years; especially the art of splicing.

He didn't let his disability stop him, and until the last few months, he could be seen 'scooting' around Armidale at full throttle.

Peter was known in the District for his work in processing used stamps to raise funds for RAWCS. Boxes of stamps would come to him from all over the district; he would patiently trim and re-box them for hours.

He was a devoted, much loved Rotarian who, until recently, proudly held 100% attendance for most of his 29 years with the club.

Honorary membership was conferred on him when his health no longer allowed him to attend. A number of club meetings were able to be held at his home in Autumn Lodge.

While his club members were meeting face to face for the first time on Wednesday morning, Peter was saying his final goodbyes, with his family by his side.

His wife, Karen, pre-deceased him and he is survived by his children and grandchildren.

Can you help with a donation of \$250?



More than \$18 million in Foundation global grant funding has been allocated to environment-related

projects over the past five •


years. Creating a distinct area of focus to support the environment will give Rotary members even more ways • to bring about positive change in the world and increase our impact.

Supporting the environment becomes Rotary's seventh area of focus, which are categories of service activities supported by global grants. It joins peacebuilding and conflict prevention; disease prevention and treatment; water, sanitation, and hygiene; maternal and child health; basic education and literacy; and community economic development.

Grant applications for projects will be accepted beginning on 1 July 2021. Gifts and commitments from Rotarians and others will be sought to provide global grant support for the new area of focus.

More information about this new cause will be announced soon.
