Nepal and therefore missed the 2019 District Changeover where he would have received the Sapphire PHF.

It was fitting that PDG Lorraine was able to present his sapphire pin at the Zone 8 Conference after he had received the Humanitarian Award.



Ray spoke with heartfelt thanks for the award, and the support he has received from our District. He also spoke about his work in Nepal and his dream to realise a Mothers and Babies hospital there. Dr Ray was able to sell his book, "Heartbreak in the Himalayas" at the Conference and all stock that was taken to Christchurch by Ray and some others was able to be sold. Not only that, a number of people made substantial donations to the project as well.

Ray travelled from New Zealand to the US to speak at a number of Rotary Clubs and other events, organised by PDG David Hare, who lead the team of Project Partners in the US and Iceland for the global grant set up by DGE Debbie Loveday and the Port Macquarie Rotary Club, to outfit the Hospital with the equipment they will require. With funds from our own District Designated Fund and our project partners and RI contributions, the target set to outfit the hospital has been achieved.

A wonderful outcome for our District and the women of Nepal.

D9650 Foundation District Grants applications

District grants are funded from Foundation contributions made by Rotarians individually and Rotary Clubs in District 9650 3 years ago. The amount available for District Grants is governed by the total amount of Donations to the Rotary Foundation Annual Fund in the 2016-2017 Rotary Year. This is another great reason that Clubs and individual Rotarians ought to contribute to the Rotary Foundation Annual Fund.

District Grant money is our money to be spent in our District to support projects both locally and overseas, to a value of approximately AUD4,000 each.

Last year Bellingen Rotary Club applied for a grant to install and maintain a “Skyjuice” system in a school in Bhutan. Glen Innes Rotary Club project was to supply 1200 “Days for Girls” kits to Indonesian islands. Port Macquarie Sunrise used funds to sponsor RI youth programs. Rotary Club of Wauchope assisted with the implementation of a Dog Park in Wauchope and 11 other clubs were given District grants for a range of varied projects.

These projects might be small yet can make a huge difference when completed. Every club in District 9650 has the opportunity to apply for a grant to “make a difference”. Applications must be in by 31 October 2019 so please consider applying for your club’s grant sooner rather than leaving it to the last minute.

All information is available on the District website. I look forward to your club’s application for a project that will uphold our Rotary values of “Service Above Self”.
