



The Rotary Club of Rocklin/Loomis Basin Mini-Grant Program

What is the Mini-Grant Program?

The Rotary Club of Rocklin/Loomis Basin will award a limited number of mini-grants, with a minimum award of \$50 and a maximum of up to \$250, for special classroom projects. The grants are made to individual teachers of all schools, grades K-12, located within our service area. The mini-grants provide funds to innovative teachers who desire to develop new ideas to enrich student classroom experiences. The mini-grants are awarded to teachers who do not have other sources of funding, or will have to use their own funds to support the project.

Who is Eligible to Apply?

Public school teachers, grades K-12, within the Rocklin and Loomis School Districts.

How are the Awards Determined?

A panel of representatives comprised of educators and business professionals will evaluate the overall benefits to students. The final selections are determined by Rotary Club members.

What is the Process for Applying?

Mini-grant applicants are required to complete a brief, written project description; preliminary budget; and project calendar to be submitted by the deadline. Forms will be available at each of the schools located within the Rocklin and Loomis School Districts.

What are the Requirements?

Each grantee is required to attend a meeting of the Rotary Club in order to receive their grant award and explain the goal of the project to the members. School principals are encouraged to accompany the teacher to the meeting. At the end of the project period, a written report must be submitted to the Rotary Club summarizing the project and its success.
