

Global Grant Scholarship Guidelines for D5150

A Brief History

- Rotary is the world's largest private provider of international scholarships, awarding approximately 1,000 each year.
- In 1947, The Rotary Foundation created the Ambassadorial Scholarship to build goodwill and peace in the world.
- In 2013, that program became the Global Grant Scholarship tied to Rotary's Areas of Focus.
- The Global Grant Scholarship is not the Rotary Peace Fellowship Scholarship. These are two distinct scholarships offered.
- More than 30,000 people from over 100 nations have studied abroad.
- D5150 Foundation Chair is Jayne Hulbert.
- D5150 Global Grant Scholarship Chair is Gina Grant.

Eligibility

- This is not a needs-based scholarship and is based solely on the qualifications of the candidate.
- Candidates can be from anywhere in the world, must study outside of their home country, and must study in a country where a Rotary Club exists.
- Candidates must be sponsored by a Rotary Club in District 5150, and clubs may sponsor more than one candidate for this scholarship.
- Candidates may not be Rotarians, Honorary Rotarians, or employees of a club, district, or other Rotary entity or of Rotary International. Spouses, lineal descendants (child or grandchild by blood or legal adoption), spouses of lineal descendants, or ancestors (parent or grandparent) of persons in the aforementioned categories are also ineligible. Please note that Rotarians and their relatives remain ineligible for scholarship awards for 36 months after a Rotarian has resigned from club membership.
- Scholarship must be used for a graduate program masters, PhD, or post-doctoral program. This scholarship is not available for undergraduate studies.
- Candidates must have completed their undergraduate degree program before commencing scholarship studies.
- Candidates must either have a full offer or conditional offer to a graduate program at time of application or have one remaining full academic year of a graduate program from a multi-year program. This scholarship is not available for a partial year of study.

- Candidates must have ability to express source of funds for remaining costs above and beyond the USD\$31,500 of this scholarship (See "Additional Funding" on application).
- Candidates may seek or be awardees of other Rotary Scholarships.

Amount of Scholarship and Key Dates

- USD\$31,500 awarded for 2023-24 and may be used for travel, housing, tuition, books, supplies, and/or living expenses.

- ALL APPLICATIONS ARE DUE BY 11:59 PM (PST) ON SATURDAY, APRIL 1, 2023, AND MUST BE EMAILED BY THE CANDIDATE TO GLOBAL GRANT SCHOLARSHIP CHAIR, GINA GRANT, AT <u>GINAGRANT2@HOTMAIL.COM</u>.
- All applicants and their sponsoring clubs will be notified by email as to whether they will advance to the final interview by Saturday, **April 8, 2023**.
- Selected candidates will be interviewed individually by the selection committee for approximately 45 minutes over Zoom on Saturday, **April 15, 2023** (Specific time slot will be given to each candidate in advance).
- Selection Status Notification will be given to all candidates and their sponsoring clubs as soon as possible after interviews are completed.
- Final approval of this grant is contingent on Rotary International's approval given after the selection committee and successful candidate submit all required documentation into the portal shortly after the submission deadline of **June 30, 2023**. This endeavor will be coordinated by selection committee chair Gina Grant.

Responsibilities of Rotary Clubs

- No additional financial responsibility is required by the local clubs.
- No reporting responsibilities.
- Review the application of the candidate(s).
- If electing to sponsor, notify Gina Grant at ginagrant2@hotmail.com your intention to sponsor that candidate. (The notifying person will be receiving the status emails of the candidate through the selection process.)
- Your club may provide feedback to the candidate(s) to adjust the application(s) prior to submission.
- It is recommended, but not required, that club members meet with those candidate(s) who are selected for a final interview and help them prepare for the final interview.
- Final interview questions are listed on the application. Here they are again for you:
 - 1. Briefly introduce yourself, your background, and how your study abroad aligns with your area of focus.
 - 2. What are you most proud of and why?

- 3. What motivated you to choose your area of study, what is it about this academic degree in this country that has attracted you, what challenges do you anticipate from being in another country, and how will you adapt?
- 4. Please share with us a challenging situation you have experienced, how you overcame it, and what you learned from that situation.
- 5. After a long life, what would you like to be remembered for regarding your contributions and/or impact on your community and/or the world?
- 6. If you could spend an hour over lunch with anyone of your choice (from history or currently living) who would that be and why?
- 7. Over the course of the year, there is an expectation that you will meet over Zoom or in person with your host Rotary Club where you are studying and with your sponsoring Rotary Club from Rotary District 5150 a few times throughout the year. How do you feel about that?
- 8. Is there anything else you would like to share about yourself as we consider you for this scholarship?
- Should your candidate be selected, please stay in contact with the student and have them speak to your club over the year over Zoom, if possible.
- Promote the scholarship widely.

- Promote to local schools.
- Encourage club members to post at work and tell friends.

The Rotary Global Grant Scholarship supports academic study aligned with one of Rotary's Seven Areas of Focus (www.rotary.org/en/our-causes).

The scholarship is in the amount of USD\$31,500.00 for graduate level academic study in a foreign country for the academic year 2023-24 and must be used in total by December 31, 2024.

This is not a needs-based scholarship and is based solely on the qualifications of the candidate. Funds may be used for travel, housing, tuition, books, supplies, and/or living expenses.

Candidates may be from anywhere in the world, must study outside of their home country, and must study in a country where a Rotary Club exists.

Final approval of the grant is contingent on Rotary International's approval given after the selection committee and successful candidate submit all required documentation into the portal shortly after the submission deadline of June 30, 2023. This endeavor will be coordinated by selection committee chair Gina Grant.

This scholarship is funded by members of Rotary District 5150 (Rotary Clubs in Marin, San Francisco, and San Mateo counties) and The Rotary Foundation.

Rotary District 5150 seeks candidates who:

- Demonstrate excellent leadership skills and potential.
- Possess a proven record of success in their academic field or vocation.
- Have a commitment to community service, striving to make an impact in our world.
- Articulate how their studies and career objectives are aligned with advancing Rotary's Seven Areas of Focus.
- Agree to communicate about their experience with their sponsoring club in Rotary District 5150 and the host club in their area of study throughout their year. (The successful candidate will be notified by selection committee chair Gina Grant as to which Rotary Club is their host club during their school year as soon as possible after selection.)
- Agree to participate in an exit interview video to be shared with Rotarians and future applicants.

Eligibility

- Candidates may not be Rotarians, Honorary Rotarians, or employees of a club, district, or other Rotary entity or of Rotary International. Spouses, lineal descendants (child or grandchild by blood or legal adoption), spouses of lineal descendants, or ancestors (parent or grandparent) of persons in the aforementioned categories are also ineligible. Please note that Rotarians and their relatives remain ineligible for scholarship awards for 36 months after a Rotarian has resigned from club membership.
- Rotaract Club members and non-Rotarians are eligible for this scholarship.

- Scholarship must be used for a graduate program masters, PhD, or post-doctoral program. This scholarship is not available for undergraduate studies. Candidates must also complete their undergraduate degree program before commencing scholarship studies.
- Candidates must either have a full offer or conditional offer to a graduate program at time of application or have one remaining full academic year of a graduate program from a multi-year program. This scholarship is not available for a partial year of study.
- Ability to express source of funds for remaining costs above and beyond the USD\$31,500 of this scholarship (See "Additional Funding" section below).
- Candidates must agree that funds will be distributed according to the rules and regulations established by Rotary International and that all eligible receipts will be provided in a timely manner. The Successful candidate will be provided specific instructions on how and when to provide receipts for payment.

- Selected candidates will be interviewed individually for approximately 45 minutes over Zoom on Saturday, April 15, 2023 (Specific time slot will be given in advance).
- Selection Status Notification will be emailed to all finalists and their sponsoring clubs as soon as possible after interviews are completed.

Supplemental Documents and Video Required with Submission of Application

Please include the following with your application that is due April 1, 2023:

- Resume up to 2 pages that includes:
 - Name of Educational Institution(s)
 - o Degree(s), Major(s), and/or Minor(s) if applicable
 - o Work, volunteer, and/or extra-curricular experiences
- Transcript(s) from previous or current college or university (tertiary) studies. Include any transcript(s) from study abroad or exchange studies, if applicable. Transcript(s) do not have to be official transcript(s). Include an English translation of any transcript not already in English.
- Proof of conditional offer or admission to the academic institution where you will be studying under this scholarship. (This must be received no later than prior to your final interview date of April 15, 2023 if unable to provide at time of application.)
- Video expressing an impactful life experience (maximum of 3 minutes). Please post on Vimeo, YouTube, or any medium accessible by HTTP link with public access.
