Prior to that, she served nearly seven years as Curator at the di Rosa Center for Contemporary Art in Napa. While there was some difficulty getting a video started on Zoom, **Jacqueline Janssen**, **Mike Morrissey's** better half, filled in with her tale of being on the **Betty White** talk show with her talent... at age 5 she had memorized the Gettysburg Address. She remembers **Betty White** being so nice to her.

# The Speaker

John Legend's video musical "Glory" very much set the mood for our speaker, Noah Griffen Jr. Noah is on his second term as president for Central Marin Rotary. The presentation is entitled 'The King's Quest, The Interrupted Journey.' His is a very interesting perspective. Noah has intimate and long time knowledge of the King family. His mother grew up with MLK's mother and both women attended the same college. Noah's mother had to pass on being a bridesmaid at the wedding of MLK parents. As an aside MLKs mother always thought her son would die young.

In Noah's opinion there are three great men who

have changed the world: Mahatma Gandhi, Nelson Mandela and Martin Luther King Jr.

MLK was brilliant, attending his father's alma mater Morehouse College when he was 15. On to theology school at Crozer, and then Boston University. An aside both his father and he were named **Michael** but both officially changed the name to **Marin Luther** in honor of the religious reformer.

When **MLK** was jailed for a sit in at an Atlanta department store his parents appealed to both the **Nixon** and **Kennedy** campaigns. **Nixon** did nothing while **JFK** got him freed and immediately **MLK's** dad changed party affiliation to democrat.

**Noah** also discussed that **King** knew he was facing a rough road but had no idea of the forces against him. **J. Edgar Hoover** taped his phones, and there is a belief **Hoover** knew of the attempt to assassinate. In 1998 the family won a lawsuit against the government on this.

**MLK's** mother was also assassinated in June 1974, while playing the church organ and his bother drowned under mysterious circumstances.
