Dave told us of his serving five years on the City Council, one of those as Mayor. Dave reminded us that many former Novato Rotarians served on the City Council, including former Mayors Dave Milano and Jim Henderson, as well as Novato's first Mayor, Wayne Womack. Next, **Pres. Chris**, our Club "Cheesehead" showed us a special slide show about the 54th anniversary of Super Bowl #1. Oh, and it just so happens that the Green Bay Packers "Pasted" the Kansas City Chiefs 35-10 to win the 1967 AFC-NFC Championship (Super Bowl #1). Packers QB Bart Starr won the MVP. Speaker

Next up, **Pres Chris** introduced his bride of 34 years, our speaker, **Joni DeGabriele**, aka "**Mrs. D**". **Joni** is a great performer and teacher. **Joni** got here higher education at Michigan State, S.F. State and Sonoma State Universities. She was a teacher at Dixie Elementary school. **Joni** specialized in students that had behavioral and emotional difficulties. **Joni** developed an elementary school music program called the Musical Moments Workshop, which helped develop a person of "good character" who is kind, respectful and responsible.

We were treated to "Mrs. D and Friends" which demonstrated the technique of teaching emotional coping tools using interactive songs. The first example was a version of "This Little Light of Mine" with additional positive message lyrics added by Mrs. D. When we heard the key word "Light" we showed "Jazz Hands", when hearing "Kind" we waved. Mrs. D played her acoustic guitar and sang and we moved our hands on queue. Next up was Mrs. D's puppet friend Spunky Monkey, who appeared after being coaxed by hearing the tune "Where is Sparky" (think Frere Jacques). With Mrs. D's ventriloquist magic Spunky helped us learn about how to be kind and deal with "unhappy" emotions using "feelings tools". First, all feelings come and go. Second, when we are feeling very unhappy, take slow, deep calming breaths which not only calm us, but give us time to think about our reaction. It worked so well, it put Spunky to sleep! Next Mrs. D picked up her guitar and we learned the "Wiggle Song" which had us wiggling and shaking hands, arms, etc. to relax. We were reminded that all feelings are okay, but not all behaviors are okay. It was time for Spunky to take a rest and meet "Grateful Gus the Gator". Gus showed himself after we started chanting for him to come out. Gus taught us that being grateful is being happy with what you have. Gus and Mrs. D sang a duet of "Keep on the Sunny Side". And we learned to find the "at least" in a bad situation, for example, we can't all get together in person, but "at least" we can Zoom meet. Mrs D. sang Simon and Garfunkel's "Feelin' Groovy" encouraging us to get out in nature and walk while thinking about that song. Spunky and Gus joined Mrs. D for a O&A session. They fielded many questions,


here is a summary of answers. **Mrs. D** has other "Friends" that address other issues, like confidence and trust. Your editor feels that **Mrs D's** technique is effective because, the children in attendance "loved it". Adults also learned tools for dealing with "COVID Grumpiness" and learning to stop and appreciate what you are grateful for, especially after a hard day. It was a timely presentation, thank you **Mrs D**.
