Service Projects - Volunteers Needed

Jim also discussed a Pleasant Valley Elementary School project on February 5 - 6. We will be working with the Novato Leadership Team to build an outdoor lab. Youth Protection Certification

Lynn Dawson discussed Youth Protection Certification. If you interact with youth in any way you need to do this. Ideally our Club will be at 100% participation for at least the first level. There are two levels of certification. There is an email out from Phil explaining this in great detail. Bottom line, if you have been fingerprinted for Rotary before, you still have to start over. They have a new system and need a live scan of fingerprints to be current. Penny Hansen had gone for the second more complex qualification. This is mandatory if you will be one-on-one with youth. 


